ST MARY'S ORGAN

As many parishioners will be aware, we have had the pleasure of the use of an organ on loan from Mr. Jim Clinch of All Organs Australia. We accepted the offer of the loan organ as the old one at St Mary's is nearing the end of its life. This loan organ has been chosen to suit the size and acoustics of St Mary's. The sound it produces is sublime, and will be even better when its speakers are properly installed. Valued at \$31,000, it produces a sound that is not only equal to, but in many respects better than a pipe organ. It comes with numerous hymns pre-installed and can have hundreds more recorded onto it. It can be operated remotely via an app from a mobile phone over Wi-Fi.

The time has come to decide as a community if we wish to purchase it. There are many benefits to buying the organ. The most important benefit is that the music it offers us helps us give praise and worship to God. If God is indeed God, we quite simply owe him the best. Having an organ that is capable of making such beautiful sound will help us attract couples for weddings in the Church. St. Mary's could also become a place where concerts are held, to help with fund raising for the restoration of this most beautiful of Churches. There will be an organ recital and workshops to showcase this organ to the wider community in April. More details will be released at a later date.

It is hoped that parishioners who are willing and are able to, will contribute to the purchase of this beautiful instrument. I myself have contributed the first \$1,000. Anyone who is willing to donate can see me, or alternatively place a note in an "organ fund" envelope on the collection plate. (The envelopes can be found at the back of the Church.) Alternatively you can send your clearly-marked donation to the regional office. Thank You.

FIRST AND SECOND COLLECTIONS What's the Difference?

Each weekend at our parish Masses, there are two collections. The 1st collection immediately follows the Prayers of the Faithful, while the timing of the 2nd collection may vary (either immediately following the 1st collection, or after communion).

THE FIRST COLLECTION goes to the support of the priests working in parishes and those on special duties. The funds are effectively 'centralized' and are distributed by the Maitland Clergy Central Fund. None of this money goes to the retired priests; their support comes from the Age Pension and from bequests specifically given for the benefit of the retired priests.

THE SECOND COLLECTION provides the income for all the running expenses of your parish - staff employment, insurance, maintenance, maintaining and operating the Regional Office and the Churches, liturgical supplies, waste collection and, most importantly, parish and regional ministries and services. Surplus funds stay in your parish and are invested to meet the parish's future needs.

First Collection: Currently the only way to contribute to the 1st collection is via a weekly cash contribution to the collection plate.

Second Collection: There are various ways to contribute to the 2nd collection:

- 1. **<u>Cash</u>** donations on the 2nd collection plate.
- 2. <u>Weekly Envelopes</u> (known as the planned giving scheme) which are placed in the 2nd collection each weekend during Mass. Contributions made via Planned Giving can be offset against any Catholic School Building Levy you may be liable for, when you have one or more children attend a Catholic Primary or High School.
- 3. <u>Automated contributions</u> via your credit card or direct debit. The Catholic Development Fund can make a charge to your nominated credit card or bank account on a monthly, fortnightly or weekly basis according to a signed authority, offering a 'set and forget' option for contributions. Of course you can withdraw your authorisation for these contributions at any time. This type of planned giving is also an eligible offset to the School Building Levy.

Many Catholic diocesan and parish works currently helping those in need in the Hunter region are made possible by bequests. Each of us finds different ways to make our mark on the world. One way of doing this is by making a bequest. A bequest is a gift left in a will. When you leave a bequest to the Church, you give a gift that lasts longer than your lifetime, a gift that will always be remembered.
