VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES ROSTER COORDINATORS

A review of the existing automated rostering system used for Tighes Hill, The Junction and the Cathedral indicates that the capability of the software to cope with the complexities of three different sites, each with differing requirements and level of demands, is not as originally envisioned. Accordingly, from the start of the next roster period (i.e. from the beginning of April), the automated rostering system will no longer be used for Tighes Hill and The Junction. The only site to continue using the system will be the Cathedral.

In light of this, there is now the opportunity for a 'Volunteer Roster Coordinator' for both Tighes Hill and The Junction. The primary task of the Coordinator will be the compiling of the liturgical roster for their location several times each year (once a quarter would be ideal) and then providing this to the Regional Office for inclusion in the bulletin. Tracking changes in availability and assisting in managing swaps would also be required from time to time.

PARISH HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE SEPTEMBER 2020

In September 2020, Fr Peter will be leading a Parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land, "In the Footsteps of Jesus", visiting the Dead Sea, Mt Nebo, Petra, the baptismal site of Jesus, Bethlehem, Nazareth, Cana, the Sea of Galilee, Mt Tabor, Mt Carmel, Haifa, Jericho, and Jerusalem. There will also be an optional extension to attend the Oberammergau Passion Play. The pilgrims will depart Australia on 3rd September 2020. A Farewell Letter from Fr Joseph

My time was very short in the Inner-city Newcastle Parishes, but I'm leaving with the warmth of love, support and encouragement. I'm sad to leave you all, but I will not be far away!

Life is always changing, and everything, whether good or bad, will eventually come to an end. As we age, our body changes. We have health problems, emotional problems and spiritual problems. Nothing in this life remains the same; only God is unchanging, and His love is always unchanging.

In a parish, from time to time, a new pastor is appointed, and the parish adapts to the new spiritual leader of the community. That has been a constant custom of Catholic Priesthood. On 23rd October 2017, I went to Kotara and was asked to stay there with Fr. Terry Horne. Terry was a very good pastor who eventually became my first trainer in the "Australian way of ministering the faithful." I stayed there nearly 150 days (6 months). I then moved to Mayfield after Easter in 2018 to assist Fr. Matthew Muller, then Parish Priest of Stockton and Mayfield and the Chancellor and Canonical Adviser to Bishop Bill. Matthew was a systematic teacher and I respectfully remember all his valuable teachings, corrections and brotherly guidance. During this stay in Mayfield presbytery, I had an opportunity to share the presbytery with Bishop Bill for more than three months. Those days were an edifying encounter with Bishop Bill. All our general conversations gave me more orientation into the challenging priesthood in this present era.

When we evolved into a Regional setup and the Moderator Model, I was asked to move from Mayfield to Stockton and I was eventually appointed Pastor to Mayfield and Stockton. I remember the day Fr. Andrew called me to the Chancery and I received my Oath as Pastor. Fr. Andrew is a kind and gentle Priest with enormous knowledge in administration. My sincere thanks to Andrew! Once we started to operate under the Moderator Model, Fr. Peter and Fr James became my companion priests to shoulder the task of the Region. Peter, our Moderator, you are a kind person and working hard to uplift the faith life of the inner-city parishes. May God be with you. James, you are a good Pastor. Keep on doing the good pastoral work that you are dearly involved with. I'm going to miss you brothers, but I'm not going very far! Call me anytime in any urgent need. If I'm free I will surely help you.

Inner city Parishes: At the outset of my ministry I had opportunities to celebrate Holy Masses in all our inner-city Parishes. My sincere thanks to all our faithful for your love, support and encouragement. Dear beloved staff at The Junction, (Margaret, Anne Millard, Anne Warren, Chris and Jade), you are undoubtedly a working force and your day to day challenges are huge, but your patience, tolerance and expertise were an eye opener for me and encouragement to my service. Accept my million thanks.

least...Mayfield and Last, but not Stockton Parishioners! As I told you last week, you were so kind to me and I tried my best to be your Pastor, but as human persons we are weak and feeble. Kindly pardon me if I have hurt you or your feelings in any way in my short ministry. I feel you have the potential to stand as a strong community of faith, place your trust in the Lord and go forward as one Faith Family. I'm going to miss my ministry in the Nursing Homes and Schools in Mayfield and Stockton. Dear Principals and dear children, we are strong, we are mighty, and we are the best! I hope you will continue in that unceasing fidelity to Our Faith and to our Alma Mater. Finally, in my poor memory if I have left anyone out, kindly pardon me and accept my sincere thanks.

I want to thank all of you for your love, prayers, and support. It is hard to leave you, but as I said in the beginning of this farewell note, change is inevitable and all of us have to adjust to it. Just remember what I said over and over. "Smile, smile, and smile always. God Loves You."

ST MARY'S ORGAN

As many parishioners will be aware, we have had the pleasure of the use of an organ on loan from Mr. Jim Clinch of All Organs Australia. We accepted the offer of the loan organ as the old one at St Mary's is nearing the end of its life. This loan organ has been chosen to suit the size and acoustics of St Mary's. The sound it produces is sublime, and will be even better when its speakers are properly installed. Valued at \$31,000, it produces a sound that is not only equal to, but in many respects better than a pipe organ. It comes with numerous hymns pre-installed and can have hundreds more recorded onto it. It can be operated remotely via an app from a mobile phone over Wi-Fi.

The time has come to decide as a community if we wish to purchase it. There are many benefits to buying the organ. The most important benefit is that the music it offers us helps us give praise and worship to God. If God is indeed God, we quite simply owe him the best. Having an organ that is capable of making such beautiful sound will help us attract couples for weddings in the Church. St. Mary's could also become a place where concerts are held, to help with fund raising for the restoration of this most beautiful of Churches. There will be an organ recital and workshops to showcase this organ to the wider community in April. More details will be released at a later date.

It is hoped that parishioners from the region who are willing and are able to, will contribute to the purchase of this beautiful instrument. I myself have contributed the first \$1,000. Anyone who is willing to donate can see me, or alternatively place a note in an "organ fund" envelope on the collection plate. The envelopes can be found at the Church doors this weekend. We have provided envelopes at all of our Churches, to enable parishioners throughout the region the opportunity to contribute. 
ENROLMENTS FOR 2020 SACRAMENTAL **PROGRAM**
