Our warmest congratulations to Margot Simmons, the recipient of the 2020 Magdalene Award for the Maitland-Newcastle Diocese! The announcement was made last Sunday at The Cathedral, coinciding with the celebration of International Womens' Day.

The award recognises a woman who demonstrates commitment to her parish community, promotes leadership and decision-making capabilities, and who ministers in the parish or diocesan community.

Margot has been a committed and hard-working member of the Catholic community in this area for many years.

As a long-term member of the Pastoral Care Team (and currently as the team's co-ordinator), Margot has maintained the parish's contact with many of the house-bound in the area by regular supportive visits. With a dedicated Rosary Circle, a statue of the Holy Mother is taken, month by month, to a local home.

Margot initiated sending birthday cards and other messages of support from the parish to home shutin's and the sick in the parish, a task which she has encouraged another dedicated parishioner to now take on. Each year she organises a working party from the Pastoral Care Team to make Christmas Pudding gifts, which are then taken to all the people visited by team members.

When, during the AIDS epidemic, MacKillop House was established at Carrington by the Sisters of St Joseph, Margot was on the working roster, cooking hot meals and encouraging others in her gentle, unassuming way. Margot worked as a volunteer at MacKillop House and with Mercy Care at Tighes Hill for nineteen years.

Hospitality has always been a feature of Margot's contributions to the parish. A great cook, she has made many cakes for fundraising events and for parish celebrations.

Responding to a call from the wider Church community, in 2018 Margot spent four months working at the Mirrilingki Spirituality Centre in Warmun, in the East Kimberley's at the edge of the Broome Diocese. She continues to keep in contact with the people there.

By the inspiration of her own quiet, gentle concern and commitment, Margot has led many to persevere in ministry. By means of her gift for contact and recognition of people, she has led many to a little glimpse of God's love and peace.

We congratulate Margot and offer our sincere gratitude for all she does, and most importantly, for who she is.

In light of the current concerns about the COVID-19 (novel coronavirus), the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle is observing the following precautions until further notice:

Individuals should consider their potential to infect others with an infectious disease, before attending a public liturgical celebration.

Holy water stoops are to be emptied of holy water.

When exchanging the sign of peace, members of the assembly are to avoid shaking hands.

Holy Communion from the Chalice is to be restricted to the celebrant(s) for the time being.

Holy Communion is not to be given on the tongue until further notice.

Alcohol-based gels or other hand sanitisers, tissues and bins will be available near the entrances to the church buildings.

Parishioners are to be reminded that if they are too unwell to attend Sunday Mass, they can fulfil the Sunday obligation by prayer within their home, reading the Scriptures, or watching Mass on television.

Those assisting in the distribution of Holy Communion are to observe good hand hygiene.

Be with the doctors, nurses, researchers and all medical professionals who seek to heal and help those affected and who put themselves at risk in the process. May they know your protection and peace.


