**LIVE-STREAMING NOTICE – 9.30AM MASS FROM SACRED HEART CATHEDRAL** The 9.30am Mass from Sacred Heart Cathedral is live-streamed (and recorded) each week. The camera is located under the choir loft and faces towards the sanctuary, though it can be directed to various parts of the Cathedral if needed.

Parishioners should be aware that they may be filmed during the celebration of the 9.30 am Mass. This filming will mostly capture their image from behind. We cannot guarantee, however, that their faces will not be featured on the live-stream or recording, particularly the case during the Communion Procession. The live-stream will make use of multiple camera angles to minimise the identification of individuals as much as possible, but this will not eliminate the possibility of being filmed.

Parishioners with concerns about being filmed or recorded should speak with the Cathedral Rector, Father Andrew Doohan, in the first instance.

#### The Nicene Creed

### OCTOBER—THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

Fatima, the new 2020 movie, streaming on Apple TV, is an evocative telling of the events of 1917, when Our Lady appeared to three young shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal. Like many a good story, the action of *Fatima* unfolds through controversy. The narrative alternates between 1917—the time of the apparitions—and 1989 when Lucia tells her story to Professor Nichols—a fictional character interviewing her for a book he plans to write about the phenomenon.

The "seers", as they are called in the film—Lucia (aged 10), Jacinta (8), and Francisco (7)—face disbelief from their parents and church and town officials. At the opening of the film we're told Portugal had recently become a Republic inspired by "liberal and enlightenment values, and was thus anticlerical". We don't really find out too much about Our Lady's prophesies during this film. The struggle of the three children provides most of the narrative momentum, while the subject matter remains a mystery and a miracle. As Lucia tells Nichols, "faith begins at the edges of understanding".

Our Lady appears to the children once each month for six months. During the October apparition the children ask the lady her name (largely to appease the thousands who have shown up to witness the event). She replies "Our Lady of the Rosary". She urges the children to pray the rosary every day to bring peace. (1917 was toward the end of the First World War.)

The movie is visually stunning. The cinematography, while a little muted in colour, is spectacular, accompanied by lush and atmospheric orchestral music. Andrea Bocelli sings "Gloria" during the closing credits and it truly is glorious.

The climax of the film is the "Miracle of the Sun", where the Sun apparently appeared to zig-zag in the sky and careen towards the Earth. Director, Marco Pontecorvo, avoids high tech gimmickry in portraying the miracle, instead focuses on the play of light from the sun on the gathered spectators. At the end of the film, we're told Jacinta and Francisco died the following year, victims of the Spanish flu epidemic of 1918. Lucia entered the convent and lived to be 97.

As we wrap up our study of the rosary during this month of October, *Fatima* provides a lovely opportunity for reflection, and to ponder the mystery of the apparitions and the power of prayer in our world. I wholeheartedly recommend the film!

#### The Fifteen Promises of Our lady

Our Lady revealed to St. Dominic and Blessed Alan de la Roche (a 15th-century Dominican preacher) additional benefits for those who devoutly pray the Rosary. These promises state that, by faithfully and devoutly praying the Rosary, Our Lady will obtain for us the necessary Graces for us to obtain these promises. It is still up to each individual soul to respond to those Graces in order to obtain salvation.

1. Whosoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces.

2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.

3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armour against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin and defeat heresies.

4. It will cause good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for Eternal Things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.

## 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.

6. Whosoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its Sacred Mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of Eternal Life.

## 7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church.

8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the Light of God and the plenitude of His Graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the Merits of the Saints in Paradise.

## 9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.

10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of Glory in Heaven.

## 11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by recitation of the Rosary.

12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.

13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire Celestial Court during their life and at the hour of death.

14. All who recite the Rosary are my Sons, and brothers of my Only Son Jesus Christ.

15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.

#### **COVID-19-Related Information**

#### **Maximum Number of Persons in Churches**

Under the current Public Health Order, the limit on the number of persons who can be present in a church is now calculated as the <u>lesser</u> of allowing 4 square metres per person within the building, or 100 persons.

In our Region, those limits are:

Sacred Heart Cathedral	100
St Mary's, Newcastle	54
St Joseph's, The Junction	100
Mary Immaculate, Tighes Hill	55
St Laurence O'Toole, Broadmeadow	55
St Peter-in-Chains, Stockton	70
Christ the King, Mayfield West	70

The limit applies to all Masses and other liturgical celebrations, such as weddings and funerals.

#### **Provision of Contact Details**

The Public Health Order requires the collection of contact details for those who attend any liturgical celebration in a church (e.g. Mass, weddings, funerals, Baptisms, etc.). If a 'discrete' group attends, e.g. a family, a husband and wife, people from the same household etc., only one (adult) member of the group is required to provide their contact details.

The contact details that are required are defined as a) name, b) phone number or email address, and c) the time of arrival.

A Contact Details Form will be provided at the door to permit the collection of these details. The Cathedral also provides an 'online' version via SignIn.com.au which permits you to sign in via your mobile phone. If you have the Service NSW app on your phone, you can also use that to sign in at the Cathedral.

#### **General Requirements**

The requirements regarding cleaning, observing physical distancing, refraining from communal singing, etc. remain in place for the time being, as does the requirement to refrain from physical acts of devotion that involve touching or kissing icons or statues.

Liturgical rituals have been adapted, and will continue to be adapted, in order to ensure the health and safety of all parishioners and visitors to our churches.

We ask those who are particularly at risk – the elderly, those with compromised health, those who are sick – to refrain from returning to Mass for the sake of their own health. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass given by the Bishop remains in place in these circumstances.

#### **Requirements for Attending Mass**

**Cathedral:** There is no need to register in advance to attend Mass. If you wish to return to Mass, you are at liberty to do so, though capacity limits will need to be observed at all Masses.

**St Mary's Newcastle & St Joseph's, The Junction**: Registration in advance is required for Sunday Mass. To register, visit the Regional website, contact the Regional Office on 4979 1101, or email the Regional Office via newcparish@mn.catholic.org.au. **Please note that once you have registered you will only be contacted if you are UNABLE to attend Mass.** 

**Broadmeadow:** Registration in advance is required. To register, please contact Gwen on 4967 5010, or Fr James on 0402 223415, or via email, jamesodoh768@yahoo.com.

**Tighes Hill:** Registration in advance is required. To register, please contact Fr James on 0402 223 415 or via email, jamesodoh768@yahoo.com.

We need to be able to contact you on Friday afternoon/evening to confirm your attendance. We remind you that if you are not registered, you are not able to attend Mass.
