## HELP!

### A REFLECTION BY ANNE MILLARD

One of my favourite stories concerns a man who lived in a two-story house near a river. One day, the river began to flood. Warnings were given via radio, TV, and shortwave. Large jeeps drove through the area to evacuate people. As a jeep drove by the man's house, he was told:

"You are in danger. You must evacuate. Get in the Jeep. Let us help you."

"No," the man replied from his doorstep. "I have faith. The flood won't get me. God will take care of me."

The water continued to rise and soon the man is on the second floor. A boat going through the area arrives at the man's house. Rescuers make every effort to convince the man to take action so that his life would be saved.

"No worries," says the man. "I have faith. Everything is okay. God will take care of me."

The flood continue to rise and soon the man is on the roof to avoid the rising water. A helicopter pilot sees him on top of the roof and hovers above the man. Using a megaphone, the pilot tries to convince the man to grab the rope ladder which was dangling above his head.

"You are in danger. The flood is still rising. Grab the rope ladder. Let us help you."

"No, no; all good." says the man. "I will be fine. God will take care of me."

The flood rises; the man drowns.

At the pearly gates, the man says to God: "I had faith and you let me die."

To which God replies: "I sent you a jeep, a boat, and a helicopter. What more could I have done for you?"

Who's task is the hardest? The person wanting to help or the person unable to recognise the help he or she is offered? I played golf with three lovely women this week. I missed a putt on one hole by a few centimetres. The gal who putted before me said "I showed you what not to do and yet you still did it!" Sure enough, I'd watched her putt and somehow made the same mistake. Silly me—I came 4th in the competition. That putt might have elevated me to a place on the podium.

Some years ago, a colleague offered me a hand moving something. I didn't need the help and politely declined his offer. His wife told me later that he'd said I was "stuck up" because I refused his assistance. What a lesson that was! I might not need the help offered, but I always need friends.

I'm sure we've all been in situations where we've wanted to help someone who just doesn't want our help. Or they want a different kind of help from what we think they need.

## A TIME OF PANDEMIC AND VACCINATIONS

"Courage, I am with you!" (ref Matt 14:27)

As the pandemic continues to disturb our world, humankind is faced with an uncertain future. We see fear and hopelessness rampant in many countries around the world. News on television continue to surprise us with rising cases of the virus and even the variety of vaccines currently available do not give us enough confidence that the pandemic will soon be over.

Seafarers in ships around the world have been affected in several ways. Aside from the usual hardships of working at sea, they have had to face more hardships as they work aboard ships beyond the expiry of their initial contracts. They also face the possibility of being infected by the virus in the countries they dock in. With air travel disrupted, flights between traditional crew change hubs have been reduced.

Although some countries have offered to vaccinate seafarers, many more nations still do not recognise the seafarers as key workers, thus, they have not prioritised them to receive the vaccine.

Nevertheless, seafarers play an important role in the distribution of food and medical supplies to countries around the world, especially places where these are

most needed and especially during this time of pandemic.

There is a high risk of seafarers' physical and mental wellbeing being affected significantly.

During this difficult time of the pandemic, we are reminded of the scriptures in Matthew 14: 26-27:

"When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear. But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

As the hands and feet of Jesus in the ports, our chaplains, managers, and volunteers are there to support seafarers in varied ways, despite the difficulties. They are there to assure our seafarers that help is still available.

Today, Sea Sunday, Stella Maris Australia (formerly called Apostleship of the Sea), would like you to remember these workers in the seas. We encourage you to pray for them.

We also welcome donations to support seafarers and for our centres to continue their services, albeit in different ways during this pandemic.

## COVID-19-RELATED INFORMATION

### **\*\*YOU MUST WEAR A MASK WHILE INSIDE THE CHURCH**

#### Maximum Number of Persons in Churches

Under the current Public Health Order, the limit on  
the number of persons who can be present in a church  
is now calculated by allowing 2 square metres per  
person within the building.

In our Region, those limits are:

Sacred Heart Cathedral 110  
St Mary's, Newcastle 54  
St Joseph's, The Junction 100  
Mary Immaculate, Tighes Hill 55  
St Laurence O'Toole, Broadmeadow 55  
St Peter-in-Chains, Stockton 70  
Christ the King, Mayfield West 70

The limit applies to all Masses and other liturgical  
celebrations, such as weddings and funerals.

#### Provision of Contact Details

The Public Health Order requires the collection of  
contact details for those who attend any liturgical  
celebration in a church (e.g. Mass, weddings, funerals,  
Baptisms, etc.).

The contact details that are required are defined as a)  
name, b) phone number or email address, and c) the  
time of arrival. These details must be recorded for  
each attendee.

Attendees are able to use the Service NSW QR Code to  
provide their details—just like many other places—  
using the Service NSW app on your phone, or via a QR  
Code reader. A Contact Details Form will be provided  
at the door to permit the collection of these details.

#### General Requirements

The requirements regarding cleaning, observing  
physical distancing, etc. remain in place for the time  
being, as does the requirement to refrain from  
physical acts of devotion that involve touching or  
kissing icons or statues.


Liturgical rituals have been adapted, and will continue  
to be adapted, in order to ensure the health and  
safety of all parishioners and visitors to our churches.  
We ask those who are particularly at risk – the elderly,  
those with compromised health, those who are sick –  
to refrain from returning to Mass for the sake of their  
own health. The dispensation from the obligation to  
attend Sunday Mass given by the Bishop remains in  
place in these circumstances.
