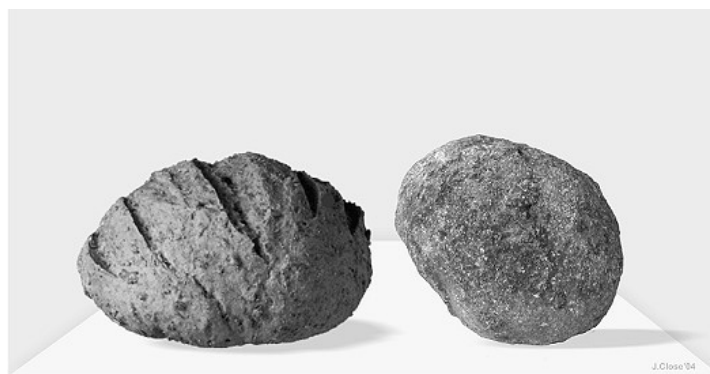

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

As Cyclone Albert bears down on the east coast of Australia I know we are all keeping our northern brothers and sisters in our prayers. They are all bracing to face this extreme weather condition. It will be a scary and uncertain time for all of them.



You may also be thinking about what they might need by way of help post this dynamic weather event. The images on the TV are both frightening and amazing.

The interviews particularly from the people of Lismore are heart-breaking, challenging to hear. Those that went through the event that washed out Lismore in 2022 have an amazing strength in them but there is a real sense that they are feeling devastated and there is an element of hopelessness creeping in. Our prayer matters and our physical support eventually will matter too.

I remember going through a cyclone experience when I taught in Japan. I was on the island of Kyushu teaching in a Jesuit High School in Fukuoka City. Being from Tasmania I had never experienced anything like it: wind, rain, and noise. After I don't think there was one tree left standing. Some of the Japanese houses are designed to collapse in a way that they can be 'stood back up'. Few things break, they bend and flex but not break. I was amazed at how quickly the Japanese infra-structure responded and how fast the clean up occurred. Every tree in the school grounds was stood back and survived. I have often thought about those Cherry Trees and the symbolism they represented to the culture of resilience and perseverance. The next year they all flowered, having faced more than one cyclonic event.

The trees didn't stand themselves up of course, nor did they survive post the event without some strong supports and care from the gardeners. That too for me was a symbol of the human condition. We do get on with it and we do have strength to face almost anything, just never on our own. Sometimes we need propping up, sometimes we need care.

This cyclone will do damage, and it will dent the human spirit and psyche of those in its path – they will get on with it after with the help of all of us. In truth we are not designed to go it alone. Jesus reminds us of that throughout the Gospels. The call on the Christian person is a call to be brothers and sisters, to be a strength, a light for the communities in which we find

ourselves. For now, we pray, tomorrow we act.

I want to invite you personally to attend the Rite of Election at 2.30pm this Sunday in the Cathedral. We have as a parish a large number (14) of people seeking full membership with us. Some will be baptised at the Easter Vigil, some who are already baptised will be welcomed into full communion with our Church. It is an exciting time for them and for us. It is a wonderful sign that we are alive as a faith family! The Spirit does the inviting, as a community we are called to welcome, support, encourage and make room for all those that answer.

JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE

A **St Benedict's Inner Newcastle Parish** has two sites in the suggested local pilgrimage sites: Sacred Heart Cathedral, Newcastle West, and St Mary's, Newcastle.

Pilgrimage to Sacred Heart Cathedral

While the Cathedral is open to all every day of the year, we have added a special opportunity for prayer during the Jubilee Year. Join us for Vespers at 5pm on the first Thursday of each month commencing in March and concluding in November: April 3, May 1, June 5, July 3, August 7, September 4, October 2, November 6.

Vespers (also called Evening Prayer) is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office.

The Liturgy of the Hours includes several specified times of prayer. The most important times, called the "hinge hours," are Morning Prayer (which takes place upon rising) and Evening Prayer (which takes place as dusk begins to fall).

Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God. The structure of Evening Prayer is as follows:

Introductory Verse, Hymn, Psalmody - singing or reciting two and a canticle (or hymn)

Scripture Reading, Responsory, Gospel Canticle, Intercessions, Lord's Prayer, Concluding Prayer, Dismissal

Pilgrimage to St Mary's, Newcastle

Join us at St Mary's, Newcastle each Saturday in May (the month of Mary) between 11am and noon to spend a gentle hour in prayer and reflection on Our Lady.

May is considered the "Month of Mary." This time offers a lovely opportunity to explore her role and significance in our Catholic tradition and how her life and virtues continue to inspire followers of her son, Jesus.

Each Saturday morning in May, we will reflect on Mary. Her example of humility, obedience, and unwavering faith makes her a central figure in worship and a guiding light in the lives of many around the world. 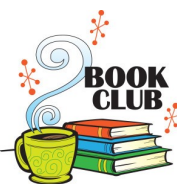

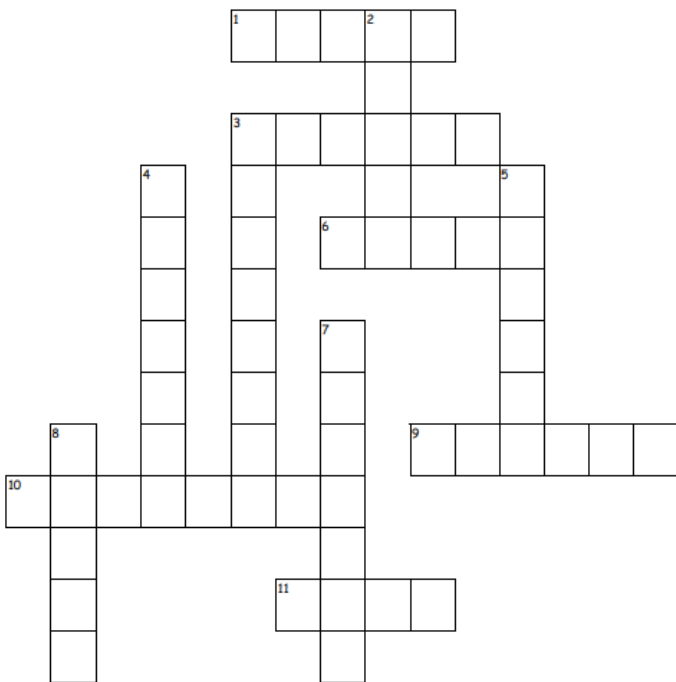

REFLECTION BY FR MICHAEL TATE

Temptations

After his baptism Jesus was driven by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness where the devil put him to the test. Jesus was offered three shortcuts to his living in harmony with the will of his Heavenly Father.

First, when *he* was hungry there would be bread out of stones.

Second, when he wanted to change the world he could have absolute political power.

Third, when he needed to take risks, angels would keep him safe.

Our baptism does not insulate us from the same threefold pattern of temptation. Do you find yourself saying:

I want the whole world to change to satisfy me, *or*

I want to exercise power over others, *or*

I want to take stupid risks and come out unharmed, *or* all three!

What must we do when such temptations assail us?

Realise that such temptations are much less powerful than they seem – the last gasp of the vanquished devil. Imitate Jesus in going to the Scriptures, preferably the Gospels, in order to have the words to hurl back at the devil as you are tested.

We could pause to make a Lenten resolution to read a Gospel, and to do so confident of our Baptismal identity as beloved daughters and sons of God.
