He carries to the hopeful an understanding of a modern world and the needs of the young in that world, as well as the challenges of the poor and outcast. Social Justice plays a huge part in the name chosen. At 69 we look forward to his long and fruitful leadership of our Church.

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

I was reminded this week of an app I have on my phone. It is free through the App store, and I believe it is a useful tool for everyone. It is an initiative of the NSW Police and is called **'Empower You'**. It has a lovely logo (black coil with coloured rays) which hides its protective and data saving intent. Victims of domestic violence can record or document what is happening to them or to those they love. The app time-stamps the entry and exports it to the cloud and it can't be deleted. When needed, or when they are ready and able to go to police, it can be downloaded by the police and used in evidence. It is a fantastic initiative and again useful for everyone to have. Check it out and let me know what you think.



As a community we stand in solidarity with all those who are abused, ready to speak for them, to support them and to be their courage when they are ready to seek help. Domestic violence is complicated for those who suffer in it, there are reasons they can't stay and there are reasons they can't easily leave – we must be their voices. Violence against anyone, women and children particularly, is not acceptable.

As we celebrate Mothers' Day this weekend, isn't it great to acknowledge and appreciate those that are mothers or are like mothers to us – those that nurture, care for, support, encourage, love, give life. Good opportunity to ensure that we don't take their giftedness for granted. Thanks mums, for all you do for your family and for us.

I am also thinking of those mums who are estranged from their children, through some wrong or through no fault of their own. Some will be separated through work, circumstance and distance. We pray, don't we, for those mums whose children have died. Hearts that go on but never really mend. A mum never stops being a mum.

I am also praying for those who are adoptive mothers, some through a legal process, some through a care of another, some as aunts, friends and mentors. We stand with those mums who for many reasons care for others and maybe with the sadness of not carrying their own. They share a precious gift of love more generous for its grace.

I am thinking today too that there are many amongst us for whom this day is not a joy. Some have lost their mum to death, God's invitation to go home. There is something about our relationship with our mum, for good or not, that makes that separation raw and

difficult. We think of the graces and blessings, the things we have learnt from them and the advocacy they offer for us. Their prayer continues in this life and the next.

To all the mums, thank you for all you do. I hope that you are always appreciated, cared for and loved. May today be a day of blessing and grace.



SAFEGUARDING



The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of protection within our Parish. This week, you are reminded of **the legacy of Pope Francis regarding safeguarding of minors and vulnerable adults.**

Pope Francis, who served as the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church from 2013 until his death in April 2025, leaves behind a transformative legacy in safeguarding minors and vulnerable adults. His legacy includes a more transparent, victim-centred approach to abuse cases and institutional accountability. In 2019, he convened a global summit on abuse prevention, signalling a shift toward universal responsibility. He also implemented 'Vos Estis Lux Mundi', a key legal reform mandating bishops to report abuse and cover-ups, marking a crucial step in holding Church leaders accountable.

Francis abolished the "pontifical secret" in abuse cases, allowing for greater cooperation with civil authorities and support for survivors. Under his leadership, the Vatican has disciplined high-profile figures, such as ex-Cardinal Theodore McCarrick, reinforcing a no-tolerance stance.

Overall, Pope Francis's legacy on safeguarding is one of progress, marked by notable reforms and a commitment to cultural change within the Church. While challenges persist, his efforts have laid groundwork for a more accountable and survivor-focused Church.


