FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

My condolences to our parishioners of Indian heritage who may have friends and family suffering because of the tragic loss of Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner



which took off from Ahmedabad Airport in western India and crashed shortly after killing all but one passenger on board. Hearing on Friday of the late change of seat for the man in 11C I reflect is a miracle in its own right. It is a tragedy that sends ripples around the world. People, friends, we may know, will be suffering as a result. Even without knowing anyone on board, tragedies in homelands affect those from there deeply – you are in our prayers.

Our hearts too go out to those affected by the tragedy in Austria. I'm not sure why guns can't be better controlled or why people who don't need them have easy access to them. I know you join me in prayer for all those affected. There is not one thing that happens overseas that doesn't affect us here due to our diversity but also our faith.

I am struck by the diverse and multicultural face of our parish community. Almost every nation on earth is part of our parish and as such brings such wealth of experience, tradition and hope. Everyone is here for good reason – hope filled for a wonderful future. I was trying to list as many as I knew this week, I'm sure I've missed some, please let me know if you are from a country I don't mention and recognising that some of us migrants were born here, some of us have combinations of heritages and our First Nations people have been here for over 10,000 years: First Nations, Tasmania(!), India, England, Ireland, Italy, Philippines, Poland, South Africa, Tanzania, Kenya, Nigeria, Tonga, Samoa, Fiji, New Zealand, America, Brazil, Columbia, Peru, Argentina, France, Spain, Scotland, Greece, Lebanon, Germany, Netherlands, New Guinea, Indonesia, Japan, Thailand, Malaysia, Russia, Slovenia, Slovakia, Eritrea, Iraq, Sri Lanka, Croatia, El Salvador, Vietnam, Nepal, Mexico. Again, if I have missed your country of origin let me know. I was just running a list of faces that I have met in our various churches, so easy for me to miss a country.

What strikes me is the diversity of religious tradition that each one of you brings and which enhances the life of our faith community. I was struck before Easter that the members of our Polish community gathered with baskets of food that was blessed; symbolic foods like eggs, bread, salt, and meat. All the baskets were decorated beautifully. The blessed food is shared at the Easter breakfast on Sunday, a joyful return to

abundance after Lent. I know other cultures have this too, but why can't all of us join this beautiful tradition? In many ways we could extend that idea, maybe feeding the homeless – enhancing our mission and the wider community in need.

I would love to draw up a list of traditions that maybe you miss from home that we could join you in celebrating here in your new homeland. There will be I am sure overlaps, opportunities for rethinking and possibilities for building up God's kingdom here in this Parish with colour and joy. Let me know your thoughts.

NOTICE TO PLANNED GIVERS

Parishioners who require a tax receipt for Planned Giving for the 2024/2025 financial year must notify the Parish Office by Monday, 30 June 2025. Please submit



requests in writing by one of the following methods:

- Email to newcparish@mn.catholic.org.au: Use the wording, "Please provide me with a Planned Giving tax receipt" and include your name and envelope number. OR:
- Planned Giving Envelope: Write on your weekly envelope, "Tax receipt required".

Tax receipt data will be processed immediately following 30 June 2025. If you make a request after that date, you will not be eligible for a receipt nor a tax deduction in relation to your Planned Giving contributions. This is because there is a designated sum that can be attributed to Planned Giving receipts and, once this distribution has occurred, no further allocations are possible.

The 'designated sum' provision also means that the claimable amount for each giver decreases when more people request a receipt. We therefore ask that if you do not intend to claim a tax deduction, please do not request a receipt.


