

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

At the end of the year, we will begin preparation for our Parish Assembly – on 1 November, All Saints Day. This will be session one of what I hope will be a Trinity of meetings that should, at the end of the process, see us with



a strategic plan and a map for developing our pastoral plan for the next three or so years. We do have some big decisions to make and some strategic mapping for the future to do.

I have spoken already to some and particularly our Parish Pastoral Council about the need for proper 'closure' and a period of storytelling, much like we would do at a Wake, for those masses and churches that have either closed or changed. There was good reason for the need to close our churches and alter our masses; it is important though for us to make sure we don't lose our history, tradition or, just as importantly, our stories together.

I'm aware that we will never be able to re-open St Columban Catholic Church; St Laurence O'Toole will possibly be in the same 'boat'. I acknowledge too the other Churches, as in Merewether Beach, and I know that St Joseph's Catholic Church in The Junction had its Masses changed to welcome the community from Broadmeadow. It has been like this since the Catholic Church arrived in Australia – we built, closed, rebuilt churches as communities shifted and changed, people came and went, celebrated births (baptisms), deaths (funerals) and marriages. They are all part of the kaleidoscope of our faith communities - recognising that the church wasn't the building, but all the people that gathered around the altar, heard the word of God and were transformed by the Eucharist for mission.

I am looking for people from the various churches that have been part of those communities to help us tell the story of the people and history of those places. Do you know the people who might come to assist us? Do you have photos of celebrations and events? I am hoping to run two opportunities to celebrate and grieve, reach closure, for those communities.

It will mean time for telling the story, viewing the icons and pictures of those churches and the wonderful people who worshipped and celebrated life there. It will mean a time to acknowledge the sadness of the loss, to give thanks for the life we shared, and then to take the good (graces) to the next stage of our life together.

Will you come? Will you tell others? Will you share

your memories? So, lock in these dates (8 August 5.30pm Mary McKillop's feast day, 8 September 5.30pm Our Lady's birthday) and stay tuned for more information. Best wishes,


