FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

The man said to the boy 'Tomorrow will be better'. 'What if it's not?' 'Then tomorrow, you say it again – because at some point, tomorrow will be better.'



Dear Parish Family,

The above was a meme that popped onto one of my social media platforms this week. Sometimes things arrive just at the right time don't they? I had a conversation earlier in the day with a man who was struggling to get through a few challenges, big challenges really, and to still be optimistic in the face of that adversity, at least see a positive outcome. Haven't we all been there at one time or another? It's hard. A positive attitude is hard to find, but key, and **sometimes** you put on a brave face, a smile even, though you don't feel it. It's hard.

One of the things I like about the 'R U Ok?' platform is it gives permission to ask a difficult question, permission to listen to the answer, and permission to make some response even if it is simply permission to be present. It should be 'R U OK?' Day every day! It also gives permission to '**not be ok**'. Faith tells us that at every turn. It's ok not to be ok. It is ok to need help, be given help, to offer help. Faith also tells us, '... at some point, tomorrow will be better.' That's HOPE. That's our Christian hope full of the certainty that is God in our lives.

Robin Williams the comedian we now know was fighting a very real struggle with depression, his dark demons. The dark side I guess of his humour and comedy that he used to mask his suffering. It was a fight he tried to get through alone. That is the sadness of that darkness, the lonely and aloneness that those who suffer with it feel, they have to face alone. I hear the desire not to be a burden, not to cause suffering for loved ones, others have their problems too. What a privilege when they let you in to help with the load, to be the companion on the way, the one to help bring some light. A problem shared is a problem halved – I'm not sure who first said that, but it is truth.

Robin Williams once said: 'everyone you meet is fighting a battle you know nothing about. Be kind, always'. We do meet lots of people along the way and in our everyday that we know nothing about their back story, home life, personal struggles. Maybe our kind word, or action the one thing that lifts their spirits, brightens a little their day, adds hope where they might have been struggling to see hope. I pray that what we carry with us, even in our days of difficulty or struggle, is that light that Christ is. *Reminding us that tomorrow, at some point will be better!* And we

remind others of that same joy.

By the time you read this I will have had the pleasure this week of standing in for Bishop Michael at two Confirmations, celebrating the Gift of the Holy Spirit in the lives of amazing young people. I noted Bishop Michael at our Confirmation Liturgies talked about the breath of God breathed into their lives as on the first Pentecost when flames of fire settled on the heads of the disciples and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. It's the Holy Spirit that helps us always see the light and feel God's hope.

NOTICE TO PLANNED GIVERS

Parishioners who require a tax receipt for Planned Giving for the 2024/2025 financial year must notify the Parish Office **by Monday, 30 June 2025**. Please submit requests in writing by one of the following methods:



- **Email to** newcparish@mn.catholic.org.au: Use the wording, "Please provide me with a Planned Giving tax receipt" and include your name and envelope number. **OR:**
- **Planned Giving Envelope:** Write on your weekly envelope, "Tax receipt required".

Tax receipt data will be processed immediately following 30 June 2025. If you make a request after that date, you will not be eligible for a receipt nor a tax deduction in relation to your Planned Giving contributions. This is because there is a designated sum that can be attributed to Planned Giving receipts and, once this distribution has occurred, no further allocations are possible.

The 'designated sum' provision also means that the claimable amount for each giver decreases when more people request a receipt. We therefore ask that if you do not intend to claim a tax deduction, please do not request a receipt.

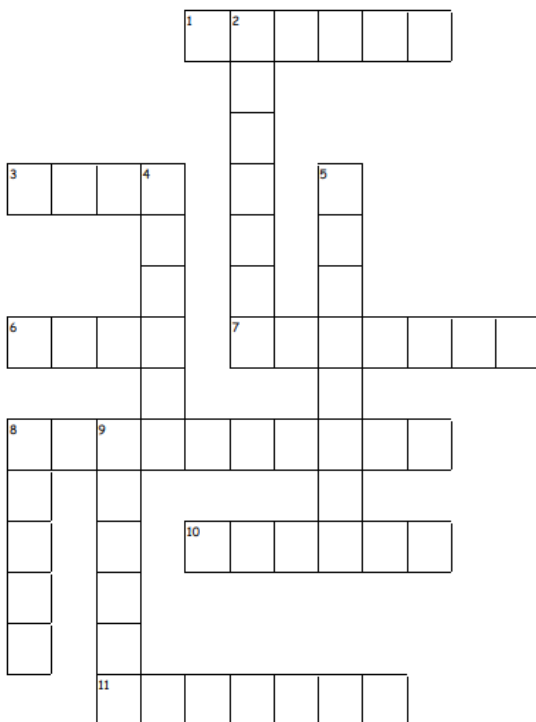
