FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

What an amazing community we are. Thinking back over the week, we've had some wonderful opportunities to celebrate our life together and to support each other. From the NAIDOC celebration on Sunday to Rosa's funeral on Wednesday, to our meetings, to our



weekday masses, to our opportunities for singing, praying, worshipping, we've gathered and supported.

I would say to all of you as my parish family don't let an opportunity go by to support, encourage, experience or share faith. One of our many great strengths is our multicultural make-up: we walk this sacred land drawn from many backgrounds and lived cultural experiences. Our First Nations people were the first, (there is some evidence to suggest that the Tasmanian Aboriginal people walked here first before heading south ahead of another migration of peoples — Tassie has led the way from the beginning!!! LOL) however there have been and will continue to be new peoples coming to join our country and make this place home. We have opportunity in abundance to share who we've been, who we are, and who we will become.

This week much of our faith story has centred around two gospels: Luke 9 and Mark 6. Both instruct the disciples to go out but taking nothing with them 'He said to them, "Take nothing for the journey, neither walking staff, nor sack, nor bread, nor money. Nor are you to have a second tunic.' (Lk 9:3) It's a big call this invitation to do God's will, trusting in his providence to provide. We must see it too as an invitation to move from what we know and are comfortable with, our comfort zone, to a place of uncertainty, but where there are endless possibilities for not only our own personal faith growth. The invitation as we grow is to share what we have with those who need it most and to invite them to this wonderful table around which we sit and share the love of God.

Whether you are new to the parish, or have been here for a millennium, your gifts, talents, and life are important and valuable. If you are a visitor, you are very welcome, you are part of our family. If you are new, you have a space and place here and we are looking forward to getting to know you. If you have been here awhile and we have yet to meet you, I apologise – make yourself known at the door and the connections to be made are endless. If you have always been here the challenge is to make space – we are good at that when we let ourselves move up.

I get torn about people sitting in the same seat every Sunday: it is a comfort to me when I look into the gathering and wonder where you are if you are not in the same seat. It is also a challenge that we might not be making the most of our opportunities to build our family and make those incredible connections that strengthen us for the ministry and mission of our week ahead. I love hearing stories of the person who met someone for the first time and then

bumped into them a few days later in the supermarket!

I am still looking forward to hearing of your cultural needs and how we might as a community celebrate some of them together. I missed Malta off the list a few Sundays back: did I miss anyone else? Don't forget to send us an email if you are new so we can stay in touch with our bulletins and parish updates.

SAFEGUARDING

The Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has a comprehensive safeguarding training regime to ensure that diocesan workers have the appropriate level of knowledge, skills and awareness to assist in safeguarding children:

- As a part of their induction, all new employees are introduced to the Diocese's safeguarding framework, including the central role of the Office of Safeguarding (OoSG)
- Diocesan employees participate in annual safeguarding refresher training
- Unpaid helpers (volunteers) and contractors receive safeguarding training as part of their induction to the Diocese
- Staff in child-related work are required to attend an advanced safeguarding training course within six months of starting employment with the Diocese.
- Advanced safeguarding training is mandatory for staff in child-related work in diocesan schools, early education centres and welfare services as part of a cycle to updating and reinforcing the Diocese's safeguarding practices.
- Diocesan clergy participate in safeguarding training as well as receiving advanced and specialist safeguarding training with the Director of Safeguarding.
- Targeted safeguarding training for work groups or workplaces identified as having or potentially having a deficit in safeguarding knowledge, practices or culture.

Safeguarding training is compulsory and is provided free to all diocesan workers.




Historica

Priests and Levites

The priest and Levite get a pretty bad wrap out of this story. Yet, their behaviour would have been unremarkable to the original audience. In Jewish culture, to touch blood made a person ritually unclean and unable to participate in religious rites. Both characters in the story were heading towards Jerusalem - towards the Temple to carry out their religious duties. To touch the bloodied man would have meant that they were unable to perform their duties. The audience would have expected nothing different from these two men. Their 'crime' was to place duty before compassion and the needs of another.

Culture and Catholic Faith are each strengthened and enriched when brought together in an authentic and thoughtful way. https://tinyurl.com/NATSICCassembly


