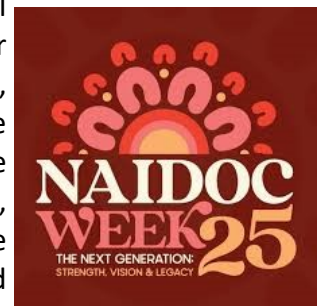

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

Naidoc Week begins this weekend (6th) and, to mark the beginning, this Sunday afternoon at 2.00pm in the Cathedral there will be a celebration, and you are invited to attend. This is an opportunity to acknowledge the traditional custodians of this great nation as well as experience something of their traditions. Our liturgy will begin with a smoking ceremony and conclude with burying a time capsule: a mixing of two traditions really.



We stand on land that has always been sacred. Our First Nations people didn't own the land in the same way many other cultures do; there is a sense of custodianship or stewardship rather than ownership, a respect for the partnership of the human to and in nature, a co-dependency to ensure its future. The 'theology' is closely aligned to our own Christian understanding of 'stewards of creation'. Think Genesis and our own creation stories with the relationship of Adam to the garden of Eden. Stewardship or custodianship rather than ownership, partnership rather than dominance and exploitation.

In aboriginal tradition one tribe or clan would not enter the land of another unless welcomed onto country. The custom was a deeply embedded part of the country. It also was a great way of ensuring several things. When welcomed to country the visitors were paying respect to the culture and traditions of those they were visiting, allowing an opportunity for safe passage and peace, and access to good water and hunting which protected the wildlife and prevented over hunting. Like any culture, waiting at the door for the invitation is a sign of 'coming in peace'. Those waiting to enter could wait for days, weeks or months.

When I lived and worked in the Northern Territory I was fortunate to participate on country in some inter-cultural days with the local families. I remember being excited when invited to one of those days that we were going to be fed traditional aboriginal food and feeling a bit disappointed when it turned out not to be crocodile, snake or witchety grubs, but silverside, cabbage and mashed potato. Great food, just a little less traditional than I was expecting.

When the first fleet arrived in Australia no one waited at the edge of country to be invited on and welcomed in. I can only imagine what the First Nation peoples thought or felt as the ships sailed in and sailors, soldiers and convicts disembarked. As a sign of respect, we either acknowledge the traditional

custodians or celebrate with an elder a welcome to country. Signs and symbols are important.

You are invited to the Cathedral at 2.00pm this Sunday as we begin Naidoc Week and pay respect to those who were custodians here first.

This is non-denominational - everyone welcome.

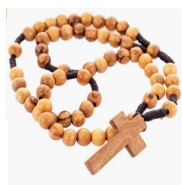
WHEN: Monday afternoon 3.30 for 3.45 start.

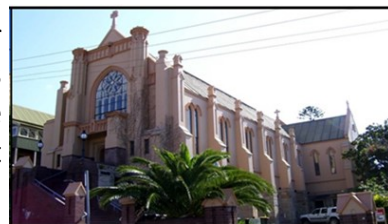

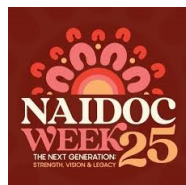


ST VINCENT DE PAUL WINTER APPEAL

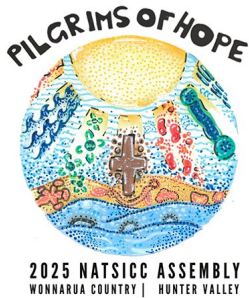

SAFEGUARDING

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish. This week, your attention is drawn to **alcohol-related harms in young people**.

Australia's drinking guidelines recommend anyone under 18 should not drink, to reduce the risk of health harms and injury. Drinking alcohol can affect brain development in young people up until the age of 25 and can increase the risk of poor decision making, memory problems, learning difficulties, mental health issues and dependence.

In Australia, it's legal for a person under 18 to drink alcohol on private property, but the person giving alcohol could be breaking the law unless they're the young person's parent or guardian, or the parent or guardian has provided permission. It is illegal to supply people under 18 with alcohol if responsible supervision is not provided.

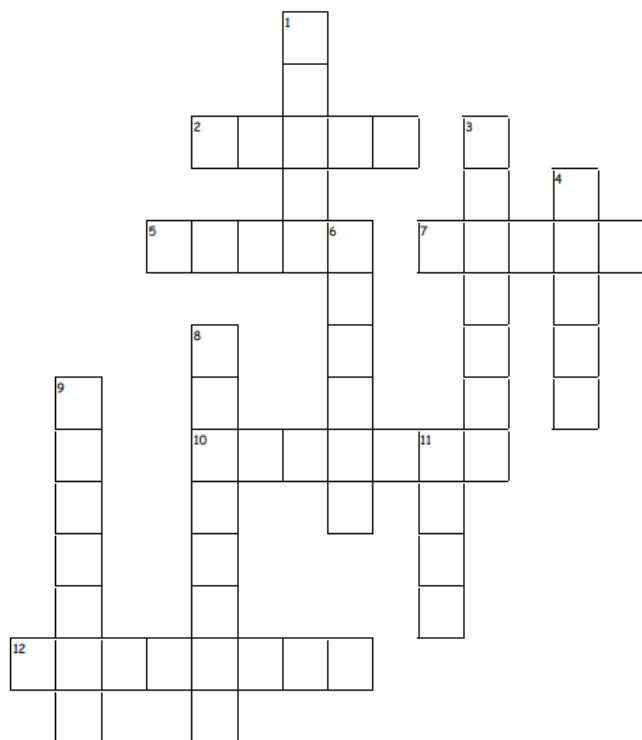
Responsible supervision refers to:

- if the adult supplying the alcohol or the young person is intoxicated
- the age of the young person, type / amount of alcohol supplied and over what period of time
- if the young person has eaten food with the alcohol
- how the young person is supervised by the adult supplying the alcohol.
