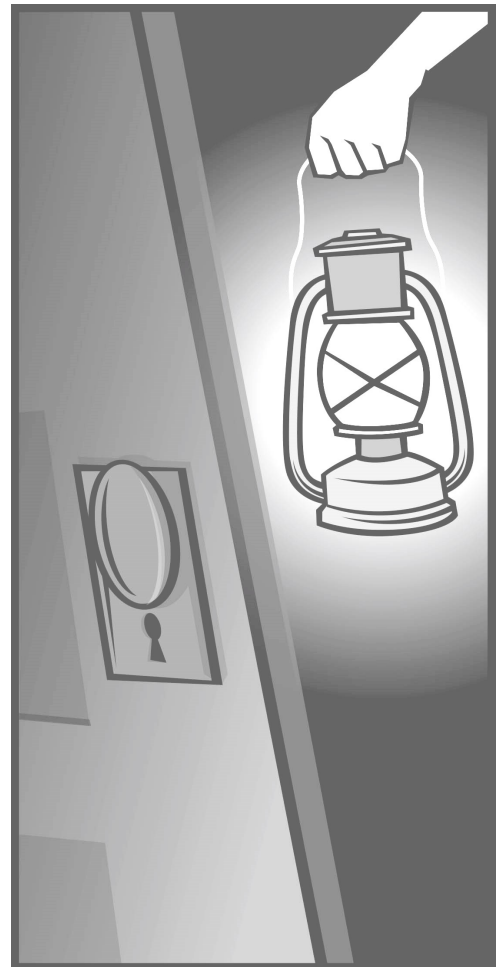

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

It was a real joy for me this week (Thursday) to join with San Clemente Catholic College and St Dominic's Catholic College as they together celebrated the feast day of St Dominic Guzman. Some of you might remember that traditionally this feast was celebrated on the 8th of August. When Mary of the Cross MacKillop was canonised, the 8th in Australia was given to her as her feast day, and St Dominic was 'bumped' to the 3rd. You may know our three schools in Mayfield (St Columban's, St Dominic's and San Clemente) are founded in the charism of St Dominic; and the Dominican Sisters as founders taught, lived, ministered and preached amongst the children and their families. It was awesome to have Sr Pat, Sr Moira and Sr Jenny present with us.

There is no surprise in how talented our young people are and a gift to hear them pray, sing, lead and celebrate. I watched one young man from St Dominic's Catholic College very proudly, devotedly and with great care carry the school candle to the front with the much bigger young men and women of San Clemente. It was a proud moment for me as he took his place in the liturgy and on behalf of his classmates. St Dominic would have been proud, if I can be bold enough to speak on his behalf, at the way our young people 'preach' the gospel through not only participating in the liturgy, but also their daily lives.

The Feast of Mary of the Cross Mackillop is a time, too, where we remember the good works of Australia's first saint. I always like to mention Fr Julian Tennison-Woods as co-founder of the Sisters of St Joseph. Mary Mackillop faced immense trials and opposition to her and her ministry as an educator of the poorest of the poor amongst the early colonists. Julian preached a retreat in one of the parish churches in the Catholic Parish of the Huon Valley where I was Parish Priest – his handwriting marking the numbers who attended can still be seen in the woodwork that once supported the main door of the Sacred Heart Church in Geeveston.

He and Mary both were tireless preachers, taking the Word to the margins of society. Mary's motto of 'never seeing a need without doing something about it' is probably the most quoted of her sayings, and if you ask any child educated under the charism of the Sisters of St Joseph, not only can they quote it, but they also know how it is lived. Most of the Parish schools were visible in the Cathedral on Friday as

Bishop Michael celebrated this remarkable woman and the priest who founded this remarkable religious order.

We know that preaching has two parts to it – what we say, the minor part, and what we do, the hardest part. Preaching is transformative – life changing, world changing, a lived reality. The young always step up when asked and always respond when invited to be generous with their goods, resources and humanity. Our saints and their witness have left a legacy for our young people to follow. In their name let us continue to pray for peace.

This week, your attention is drawn to **ReachOut** - the leading online mental health service in Australia supporting young people (12-18 years).

Despite good intentions, many families avoid meaningful chats. For many, the biggest fear is saying the wrong thing or being a burden. According to Linda Williams, Clinical Lead at ReachOut, "Shared activities like meal time or while in a car can make conversations more natural."

Linda has provided dinner conversation tips:

- **LISTEN FIRST:** The focus should be on being ready to listen rather than to try to fix things.
- **ASK LIGHT POSITIVE QUESTIONS:** Try "What are you looking forward to?"
- **DON'T WAIT FOR A CRISIS:** Regular conversations with people about things that matter build trust and strengthen relationships.
- **NOTICE CHANGE:** Changes in mood, sleep patterns, or interest in things they normally enjoy can be a sign that something is up.

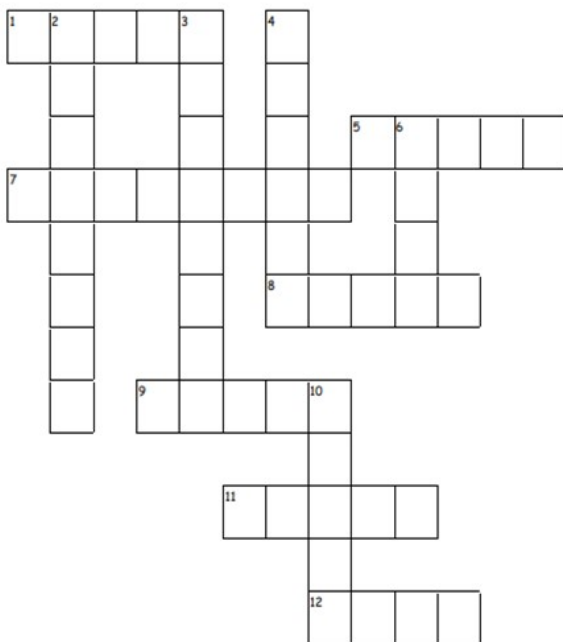
