FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

Our Parishes' Regional Pastoral Council met this last week, and we are working through a couple of processes. One is the Parishes' regional assembly that we are going

to have and need to have beginning on the 1 November, and the other is the Statutes that govern the working of the Regional Council, its membership and relationship to the community it seeks to serve. It is one of our very important groups as it has representational and governance responsibilities and I, as the Parish Priest, need to hear from it on a regular basis.

One of our challenges currently is that the membership of the council is quite small. I feel we could use more members - if you think this is something that you might help me with, I would love to have a conversation with you. It is a forum for conversation, listening to fellow parishioners and mapping ways forward, rather than a place to air personal agendas or personal issues with past practice. Each parish needs to be represented, and I think by at least two people. It would be great to have each Mass centre in the inner-city part of the community represented as well, by at least one person.

Conflicts of Interest are a big part of every aspect of our community life: in the church we have employees who are also parishioners. Sometimes it is hard to understand that relationship for everyone. The conflicts don't exclude that relationship, but need to be named, especially as part of the council making a recommendation. The only place where an employee or a person paid by the parish is prohibited would be the Regional Finance Council, which has a huge say in

how parish money is budgeted and spent. The conflict comes when they are the person receiving that funding, of course, and influencing the decision to pay it. Sometimes we walk through what I call quagmire; impossible to do but just a bit tricky. Conflicts can be hidden or overlooked especially if amounts being paid are considered small.

At our last Regional Pastoral Council all our schools were represented, but not all our Masses or parishes. The schools are doing wonderful work, and we are lucky that they are so supportive of building links with our parish and helping us develop relationships with the families whose children we educate in them. This is a place I think where more is better.

Our Promoters of Safeguarding also met this week. You will know them as active members of the parish and are Louise Outram, Kath Williams and Cynthia Tamonan. Their photos will be displayed shortly. All of us are promoters of safeguarding and, should you see something that is not right, please call it out. The toilets are not readily visible from all parts of the church, so when sending children out to the bathroom, particularly small children, can you make sure they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Teenage siblings are good too. I know it is difficult if you come as a solo parent with multiple small children.

The Cathedral precinct is very difficult, but it has a public access and thoroughfare around it, and I just don't know who apart from the congregation is around. Safety first is the motto.



LIVING THE GOSPEL - CONSEQUENCES

To be Christian is more than a name; more than a title. If we put our hand up and claim the title of Christian, then there are consequences that flow from that. Those who are disillusioned by religion frequently name hypocrisy as the major reason for their disillusionment. Sometimes, that's an easy out. We can't all live like Jesus all of the time. However, we are called to take Jesus as our model of the Christian life and to use his example as a guiding beacon. To call ourselves Christian is to try to be Christ-like in all our actions.
