FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

When we talk about Israel and Gaza, whilst it can be difficult to separate the two, we are not talking about Jews and Muslims. And criticism of the Israeli

government is not a criticism of either Israelis generally or people of Jewish faith. There are starving children in Gaza and their hunger is not differentiating between culture or faith. Remembering our Catholic Church was bombed there too.

Confusion comes for us Christians particularly when talking about Israel that we hear the scriptural references to Israel and God's 'chosen people' rather than the modern-day State of Israel and its policies and procedures. In the context of Israel, Gaza and Palestine we have to hear Israel as a sovereign state governed by a parliament. Religion is often blamed as we know as the cause of the world's ills and conflicts – religion is the excuse often for 'bad' behaviour and in times of aggression between nations, communities and peoples.

Our own prime minister has issued a statement recently, as has Pope Leo. Both calling on political leaders in that region to work harder for peace. Anyone who has travelled to Israel and Palestine will attest to the difficult and often violent relationship that exists between, what the world identifies as the illegal Israeli settlements and the Palestinian peoples in Palestine. The disparity of 'wealth' between the Israeli settlements and the Palestinian villages is easily identified: the black water tanks of Palestinian homes (7 hours of water a week) and the white-water tanks of the Israeli settlements (24 hour a day access to water) a strong symbol of that divide.

No one can condone the action that began this conflict on the 6 October 2023, when Hamas attacked Jewish communities near the border between Gaza and Israeli. Whilst the relationship between two Nations where one has been persecuted for decades may well have been a catalyst, the action and deaths of families in Israel, the taking of hostages and their treatment deplorable. Pope Leo has called in his addresses and his Homily (24 July) 'I renew my heartfelt appeal for a ceasefire, the release of hostages, and full respect for international humanitarian law,' noting that 'Every human being has an intrinsic dignity bestowed by God Himself.'

Our Prime Minister has reaffirmed our support as a nation of a two-state solution, naming what many believe 'a just and lasting peace depends upon it'. (25 July 2025) That seems sometimes like a pipe dream.

When the State of Israel was established after WWII and in response to the atrocities inflicted upon those of Jewish faith by the Nazis in what was a genocide never before seen by the world, it was hoped that those atrocities would never be inflicted on a race or nation regardless of faith, ethnicity or background again.

There is a call in this on all of us to work harder for peace. To be people of peace in our own places and families. Forgiveness and reconciliation are at the heart of peace – finding peace in our hearts for sins inflicted hard but important. Praying for peace essential. Last Sunday's Gospel reminds us to persevere in 'asking, searching, knocking.' It is important that we raise our voices for peace and not remain silent till we are heard.

SAFEGUARDING

This week, your attention is drawn to the Maitland-Newcastle Catholic Schools Office adoption of the Crisis Prevention Institute Verbal Intervention Training program for all teachers and learning support staff.

Under the philosophy of *Care, Welfare, Safety and Security*, the program focuses on responding to a crisis. This approach:

Recognises that the person knows themselves best.

- Respect the person's preference and what's important to them.
- Value the person's independence and need to flourish.
- Use an approach based on a person's strengths.

Considers the person's life experience.

- Acknowledge the trauma and its effect.
- Care is based on safety, transparency, trust, collaboration, empowerment.
- Understand effects of a person's social environment and upbringing.

Understands that everyone is unique.

- Peoples cognitive, mental, physical state influence how they interact.
- Be inclusive and culturally sensitive in your approach.

Values the person's rights and dignity.

- Always respond with respect, empathy and compassion.

The course informs participants as to why and how a person exhibits distressed behaviour, how to objectively analyse the risk associated with it, and how to identify strategies to mitigate risk.

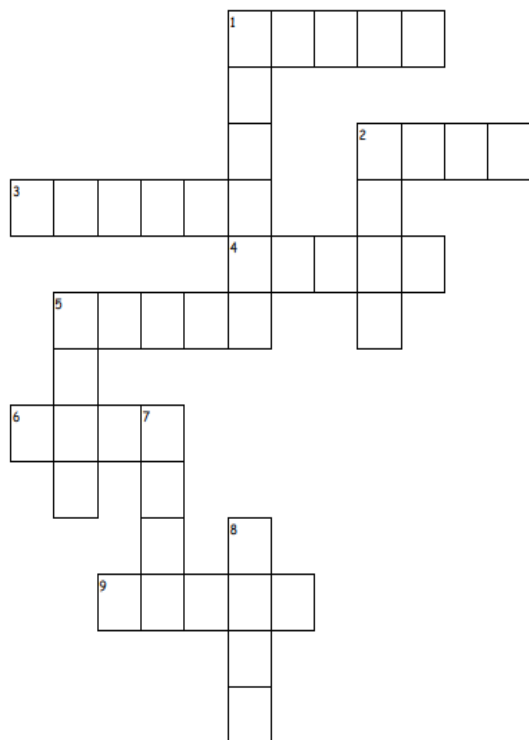

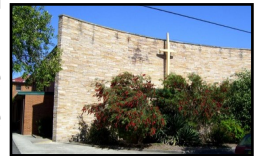
