FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

Congratulations to the Sisters of Mercy who will celebrate in Singleton this weekend 150 years of religious life and service to the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle. It is a significant milestone. I am always fascinated by the number of religious communities founded on one person's desire to 'make a difference' and often without any thought to founding a movement or, in this case, a community of religious women. God always has other plans it seems. I will have the privilege on behalf of our Bishop, of travelling to Singleton this Sunday (31 August) to celebrate with the sisters and with the parish community as the main celebrant at their anniversary mass.

Venerable Catherine McAuley established a House of Mercy in what was an upmarket part of Dublin, completely turning around the established order of the day in Ireland where the Catholic Church had been suppressed for three centuries and where Catholicism was relegated to the back streets and alleys. The back alleys are often, however, where we are most comfortable as a church, looking to meet the needs of the poor and marginalised. According to the Mercy history, Catherine bowed eventually to pressure from the church and her Order was formally established in 1831.

Whilst there were many challenges to their works of Mercy, eventually the Order took hold in areas where others in Ireland had failed, and with growing numbers of women joining the works, they were able to answer calls from around the world, including here in Singleton. The church is always well connected, wheels within wheels, with the first Bishop of Maitland, Dr James Murray, being a grand nephew of the Archbishop of Dublin, Dr Daniel Murray, who was a friend and supporter of Catherine McAuley. It was through this connection that on 31 August 1875 the first ten sisters arrived from Ireland and established their footprint in this Diocese. The newspaper of the day called it a '*red letter day for the Catholics of this locality*'. The rest, as they say, is history.

Over the 150 years of their journey with us, generations of children have been educated by the sisters in the schools and parishes of the diocese. Education, as we know, is an important key to ending poverty and empowering our future. Women, particularly, have been supported through their works and the empowering charism founded from their very beginning. My own mother was educated by the sisters in Burnie and her faith deepened as a result of

their involvement in her life. The ripples through the generations.

Continue to pray for the places around our world where Mercy needs to be embedded, especially the Works of Mercy. Prayers are needed not only for the families affected by the incident in our Catholic School of the Anunciation in Minesota, but for all families, especially the children who live without safety and security, food and shelter, education and a safe future, from Gaza to our parish here in Newcastle.

Congratulations to the sisters who have served, missioned and lived amongst us and who continue to do so. May God continue to bless their charism for Mercy; may it continue to be lived in the life of our church and peoples.

This is non-denominational - everyone welcome.

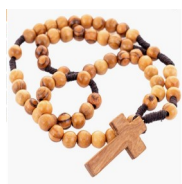

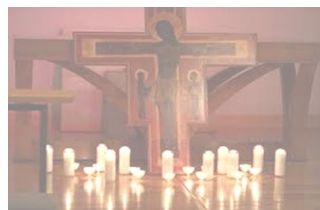

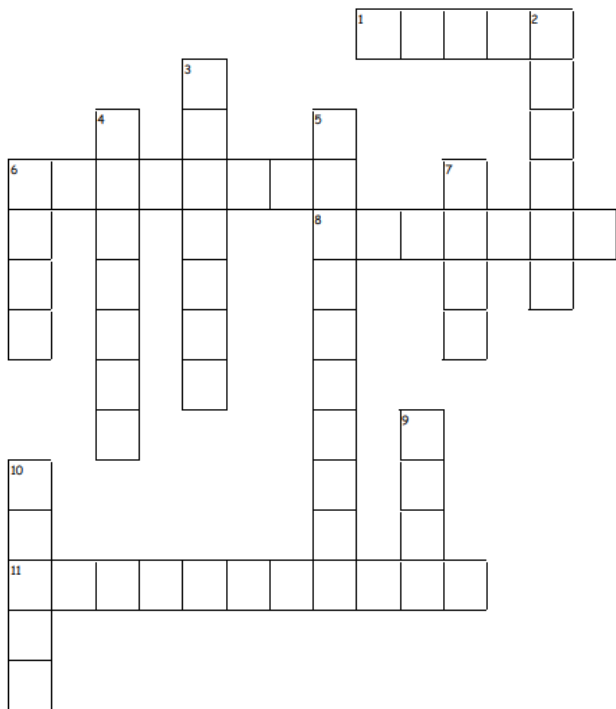
