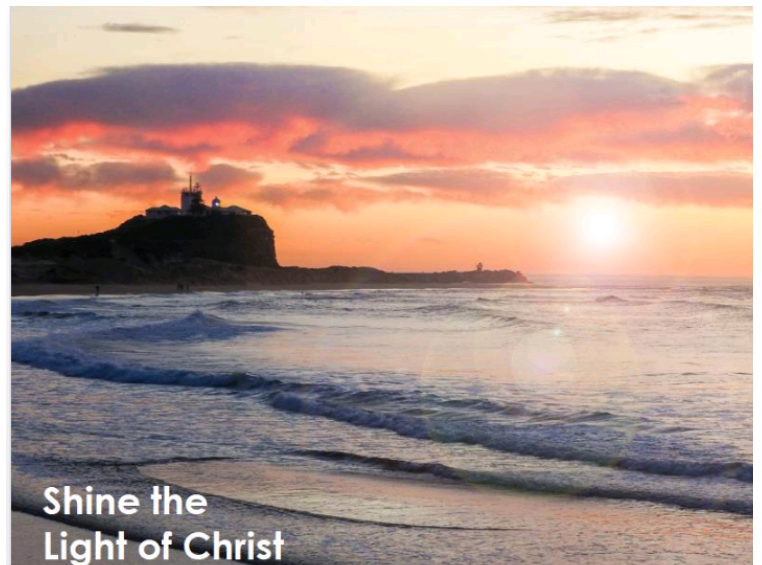

Ode to the Light of Christ

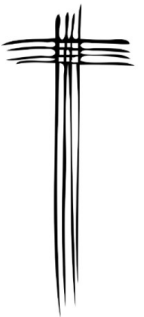
Come, let us walk in the Light of the Lord.

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

Significant and sad milestones will be celebrated over the coming weeks including, this week, the anniversary of September 11, (2001) and this Sunday (14 September), the Perpetual Day of Remembrance. For Australians too, and here in Newcastle particularly, we also acknowledge the anniversaries of the Bali Bombings (12 October 2002 and 1 October 2005), which took the lives of many young holiday makers in Bali, including three young lives from Newcastle. I have remarked many times we do not get over our tragic and critical times, our losses – we can only get through them.

I was serving in the RAAF when the planes flew into the side of the Twin Towers of the World Trade Centre in New York on the 11th of September. It seemed surreal and unreal as military establishments around the world went into high alert and lock down. I had been deployed as Chaplain to support the operations unfolding to our north, with the numbers of boats leaving places like Indonesia, making for Australian soil. Our Australian military were 'commissioned' to try and intercept them before not only reaching our shores, but before more lives could be lost at sea due to the poor condition and overcrowding of the boats carrying them. The images of the Towers falling is indelibly printed in my mind. The shock waves of the Towers falling is still being felt today, not only by the families that lost loved ones. The ramifications of those terrorists' actions inform, I suspect, many military responses, regardless of the country.

As we mark the Perpetual Day of Remembrance and approach the 20th anniversary of the second Bali Bombing and the impact of both on our own community, the families directly and the ongoing hurt to survivors, it is an opportunity to re-commit to doing and being better. All the families that suffered incredible loss at the hands of perpetrators continue to grieve the losses they suffered, loss of life, loss of childhood, loss of innocence, loss of security and safety, loss of self-worth, loss of health, loss of future, loss of family. And we know the places they should have been safe; they weren't. That is a tragedy.

Remembrance Days, anniversary ceremonies and memorials even are times we get to look back long enough to see where we've been and to stand in the presence to ensure only the good moves forward. They are moments to stand in solidarity with those that have been impacted by tragedy the day or the ceremony commemorates. And we must express our sorrow. I am sorry that too many people have been through so much in either the incidents the Perpetual Day of Remembrance acknowledges, or the many other

tragedies that the anniversaries of the Bali Bombings and the 9/11 commemorate. I am sorry, too, that similar events and incidents to ones that individuals suffered trigger again the pain they endured at the hands of evil men or women.

I am sorry that for too long the Church was silent and didn't speak. The Perpetual Day of Remembrance says that we as individuals and as members of the Church will not remain silent ever again and that we have made and continue to make a commitment to protect the innocent, the vulnerable and all those who cannot speak for themselves.

This is non-denominational - everyone welcome.

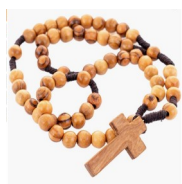

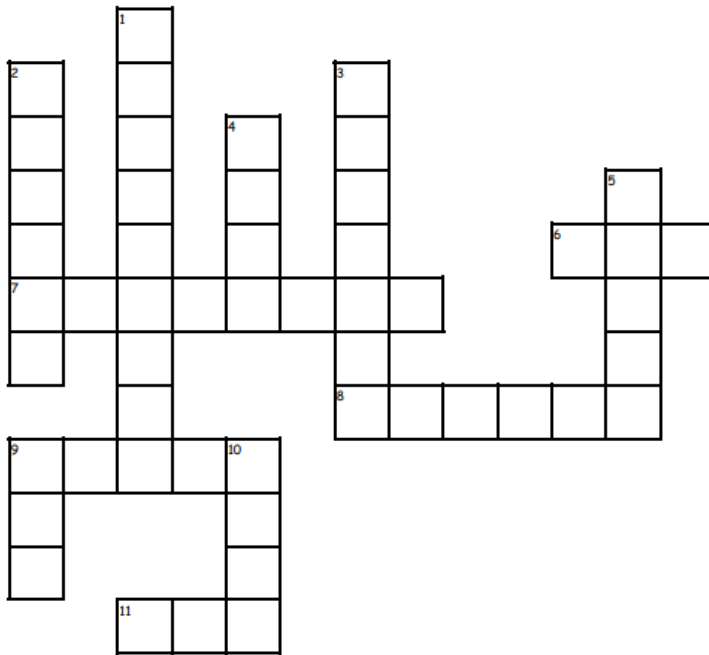
