FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

I was invited some time ago by some families from the Syro Malabar community in Taree to join with their families as their children make their First Eucharist. I was flattered to have been invited and will

make the journey Friday (19th September) to celebrate with them. It has reminded me how important relationships are for building the Kingdom of God. We belong to multiple communities and all of them are important to our lives, including the Church here and the Church of the saints in heaven – the community of the faithful here and the community of the faithful there. It was exciting for me receiving the invite.

Each time I join with our community as we celebrate together First Eucharist, I am drawn back to my own First Communion day. It was such an important day, marked with some significant highlights including the First Communion breakfast after. I know that both the Mass and the breakfast were important. I remember how special I felt and continue to feel special each time I am in Mass and receive. The breakfast highlighted how important the community, the sisters who formed us and my mother felt about the day and that moment in my faith journey. It wasn't just about the pink lamingtons or that I could eat them at 7.30am. They simply have helped make indelible in my mind and heart that day.


I get saddened when I hear or see our community not excited by the reception of the sacraments by our children and others making the journey into the Church. We should be shouting for joy each time someone is Baptised, Confirmed or makes their First Communion. This parish has many people seeking the sacraments for themselves or for their children and, like my mother, see it as an important milestone in what we hope will be a long and happy life. We should be incredibly pleased and proud that others want to join with us. We don't have to know them or their full story to see them as brothers and sisters and sharers in the mission of our church. Without each first time or moment in the waters of baptism or the table of the eucharist, we have no church.


This weekend we have baptisms and one reception into the church. Join with me as we celebrate these significant moments with all these seekers. Mitch Garrett will become Catholic at the 9.00am Stockton Mass and will walk to the Altar and receive communion for the first time. I hope there are pink lamingtons somewhere for him, but regardless, I hope he never forgets the feeling of receiving for the first time, or the joy of our community, as he joins us more formally. Mitch has been in truth a member of the parish there for some time, so will be familiar to those who gather there each Sunday. As an aside — it is also his and Aleeah's wedding

anniversary.

We should be proud that we are a welcoming and supportive community and of the part each one of us plays in making this community in the wider world what it is meant to be.




