FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,

'A HAPPY AND A BLESSED FATHERS' DAY'!

This is an important day in the life of our families and community – the church community too. At every opportunity we should acknowledge the good people in our lives, the challenges sometimes they face, and we face with them, as well as the graces. Opportunities shouldn't be missed. I think all of us recognise that it is not easy being a dad. Whilst not every dad gets that right and there are certainly some areas for 'some' where there is much to be improved or healed, fatherhood is integral to our lives. You can have many dad-like figures, so a dad doesn't necessarily have to be related to us biologically or, even in some cases where a mum or significant female figure is doing both roles, by gender. It is a role that we can't do without in one way or another, however.

As a church we do look to the relationship that Jesus had with both his Father and with St Joseph for guidance and role modelling. In both cases we see a familial and intimate nature, that is strongly connected. Jesus calls God 'Abba, Father'. It is close, it has trust, compassion, mercy, kindness, love at its heart. There is a desire in Joseph to protect as well as nurture. It seeks only closeness. I think we could also add rightness in relationship. Jesus sets a blueprint or a mud map for what that looks like and it is found in what Joseph does but also in what Jesus himself does in relation to those he mentors in discipleship, those he heals in brokenness, those he teaches and educates and those he loves.

You might have noticed that there is no manual for fatherhood – *it is a bit scary when you think it has an element of 'trial and error' attached to it* - and I suspect Joseph feels that intensely. He is uncertain about taking Mary and her unborn child home, he flees into Egypt with his family, he walks for three days in the caravan and then goes back to Jerusalem to find the 12-year-old Jesus: it is a 'trial and error' with all the elements of a father's love attached. I think sometimes when we get some of that wrong, and can then admit or own it, the most growth and learning come. It is not the getting wrong but the failure to own it that we feel most wounded or bereft. That wounding does see us estranged when we don't need to be, alone when we shouldn't be, struggling when we could have support. Relationship is not easy, and we are all always a work in progress.

Dads, I hope you have a wonderful day and know our

prayers are with you, whichever way you are celebrating his weekend.

We welcome this weekend Fr Sabu Pulimalayil as one of our Assistant Priests. He will begin this weekend getting to know the 'ropes'. Never easy being new. He will join with me at my Masses mostly, but you will see him in other places over the coming week. I know you will make him feel welcome and part of our family.

This is non-denominational - everyone welcome.

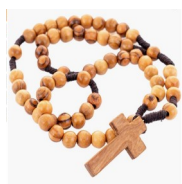

This past week (1-7 September) was **National Child Protection Week 2025** which focused on the theme: **"Every conversation matters: shifting conversation to action."** This year's message highlighted the importance of moving beyond awareness and turning our words into meaningful steps that protect and support children in every community.

9. God is always trying to give good things to us, but our hands are too full to receive them.

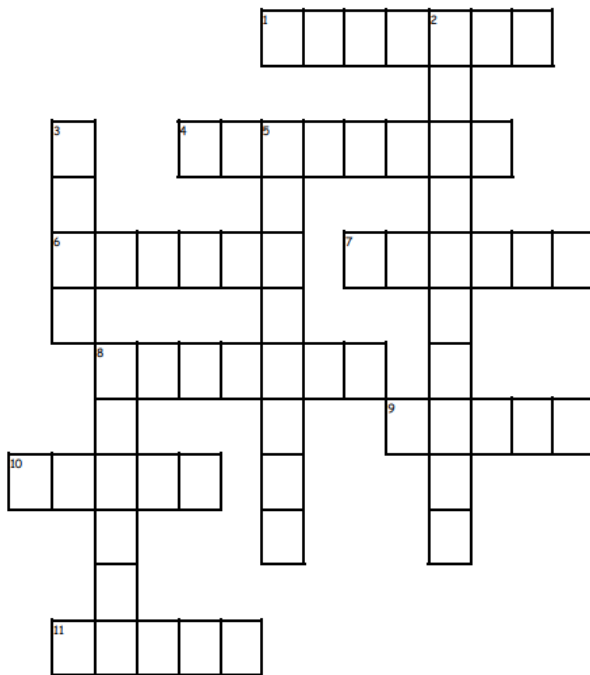
