FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

Many of us have our favourite pieces of scriptures. They give us comfort, and we often make notes about them or reflect on them. I notice when I am helping families with funerals that great comfort comes from knowing that a piece of scripture used at the funeral was strongly connected to the life journey their beloved family member made. I know it adds a quality to the celebration and makes my ministry there somewhat easier and so much more relevant.

I personally have loved Luke 5.4. In Latin 'Duc in Altum'. In English 'put out into the deep.' I have tried to live my life by it. The diocese I was originally ordained into had the motto emblazoned on the windows of the cathedral presbytery. I have always tried to put it into practice. Many elements of my ministry have been reflective of it, I hope. It is the 'yes' of what the Lord asks.

On retreat this week our Retreat Director, Bishop Greg Homeming, Bishop of Lismore took this one step further. We were asked not what our favourite piece of scripture was, but rather which event in scripture we would have liked to have been either present for or part of - which one specifically. I have spent the entire week thinking and praying about what my answer might be. I ask you the same question: what event would you have liked to be present for or part of? And you can't say all of them: it's a one event moment. The other part of the question which we weren't asked was why? It is the why that has captivated me. Spend a bit of time this week thinking about which event you would have liked to witness and why.

I was somewhat torn between the raising of Lazarus (Jn 11), the woman with the haemorrhage (Mt 9, Mk 5 and Lk 11), the Last Supper (Mt 26, Mk 14 and Luke 22 and John 13), or the crucifixion where Jesus gives Mary his mother to his beloved disciple. (Jn 19). By the end of the week, I had settled on one. However there is something about each that attracts me. Standing with Martha as she welcomes Jesus and then to witness what we have to say is pivotal in shedding light on the paschal mystery. And the power of Lazarus emerging from the tomb. What an amazing event to see.

Of course, the Last Supper is probably an obvious choice. The conversation around that table with his disciples interesting. The atmosphere, the washing of the feet and then even the breaking and sharing of the bread, wow. There is a picture in the Church dedicated to Mary Magdalene in Tiberius, of the woman with the haemorrhage; it's the most powerful yet simple depiction of the event. All you see are the legs of Jesus and his disciples with an aged hand reaching between them to touch the cloak of the Saviour. Since first seeing that icon, the event in the Gospel has so much more power and meaning for me. The realism of the event makes the healing so much more linked to me – the desperation of the woman.

I settled on the moment with Jesus, the beloved disciple and Mary. It speaks to me of family, of relationship, of unity and commitment. During all of it, it speaks that we are saved through the invitation that Jesus offers us to be family together, an amazing invitation where we know salvation through the love of our 'family'. Which is your event?

SAFEGUARDING

The 2025 Spring School Vacation is over, but **for children with dyslexia, a return to school can be a struggle**. Dyslexia affects up to 20% of Australians.

Dyslexia is a learning difficulty that affects how children read, write, and spell. It is not linked to intelligence but to how the brain processes language. In school, children with dyslexia might struggle to read fluently, spell correctly, or keep up with written work. These challenges can lead to frustration and low self-esteem.

Early identification is important. Teachers and parents should watch for signs like difficulty sounding out words, poor spelling, and trouble remembering instructions. Once diagnosed, children with dyslexia benefit from special support, such as multisensory teaching methods that use sight, sound, and touch.

Technology can also help. Tools like audiobooks, text-to-speech apps, and word processors with spell-check features make learning more accessible. Giving extra time for reading and writing tasks can also reduce stress.

It's important for schools to create an inclusive and supportive environment. With the right help, children with dyslexia can succeed in school and feel confident about learning. Working together, teachers, parents, and specialists can help these students reach their full potential.

ABOUT PRAYER

Does the teaching about the need for continual prayer mean that God needs to be convinced of our cause? It is not God who needs our prayers, but we who have to recognise, through prayer, our need for God's mercy and gracious love. The constancy of prayer is not to convince God but to remind ourselves of our dependence upon God.

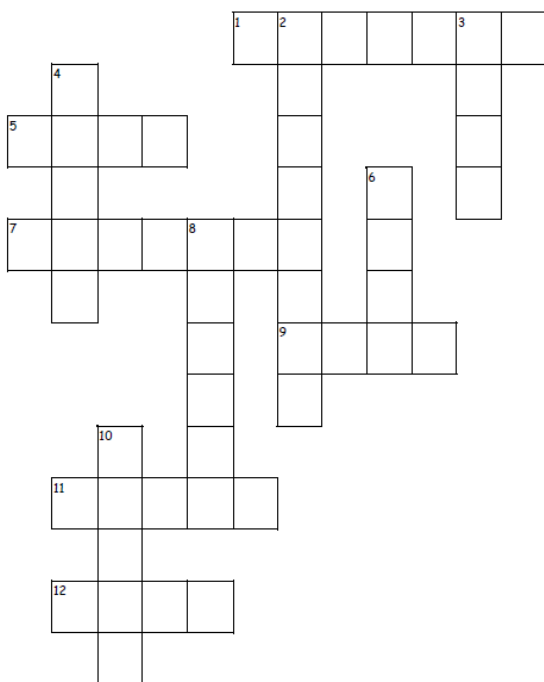
