FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

THE REGIONAL PARISH ASSEMBLY – This coming Saturday 1 November 2025 from 10.00am till 3.00pm! You are warmly invited to attend!

Our upcoming Parishes Assembly is an important event in the life of our parish. As your Parish Priest in collaboration with the Assistant Priests, Parish Council and Finance Council, I personally invite you to attend and urge you to consider accepting my personal invitation. Much has been said over the last weeks as we plan and get ready. Letting us know you are coming is helpful for preparing food, however if you find yourself available on the day just attend.

Parish Assemblies and Annual General Meetings are important. These meetings help set our Strategic Pastoral Plan which informs so many other aspects of our parish life, including where we spend money, what maintenance is a priority when we have a limited budget, what projects and missions are important, and which churches we need and which we don't. Assemblies and General Meetings, whilst hard work at times, are important as we look to collaborate, communicate and be in communion together. The Popes of recent times, as well as our Bishops, invite us to be on a Synodal journey together and to collaborate with them in building up our communities.

This Community has not had a Strategic Pastoral Plan in years. However, even if we did, every year our parish grows, changes, welcomes new members and farewells others. To be relevant in an ever-changing world we need to gather to discuss our ever-changing needs and make sure our focus is heading in the right direction. Your voice in this process is more than just important - it is vital.

We have two ways for you to tell me you are coming: one is a QR Code that all of us in our post COVID world are familiar with, and the other is a basic sign-up sheet at the back of the churches - available as you come and go on Sunday.

On the day you are invited to bring morning tea to share, and the parish will provide lunch.

His ordination on 8 November will be a magnificent gathering of our Diocese. I am looking forward to it and hope that you

are too. Anton has friends travelling from Sri Lanka and other parts of Australia. We welcome all of them.




Can you help Noah"?

Noah is a kind and caring 11-year-old who is looking for a place to call home.




