FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

This week, as you will remember, is the 20-year anniversary of the 2005 Bali Bombings, 1 October. There is much significance around this anniversary, including Newcastle's own links to the event and the young people and

their families impacted from here, those who died and those who survived. It was not an easy time for those young and not so young who were impacted and still carry all the scars of the incident. The ripples are life long and continue to affect the lives of those directly or indirectly involved. Not to forget those for whom Bali is home and the many locals very directly involved. They, too, lost loved ones and experienced the flow on of struggling to pick up the broken pieces of the homes, livelihoods and loved ones lost. What is significant in anniversaries and memorials is that they not only ensure those that were lost are not forgotten; they also remind us that peace is something that must be continually worked toward, prayed about and lived. The lessons of the past should not be lost or taken for granted. Appreciation for life is something to be valued.

This is what I know about peace and living in harmony. It takes effort and a few miles in someone else's shoes. The more we can learn about each other, each other's language, culture, experience and history, challenges and difficulties, but most of all the journey in someone else's shoes, the better chance we have of living together in peace — we might find ourselves more tolerant, understanding and accepting. Respect springs to mind.

We are so lucky to have such a diversity of cultures here in Australia – possibly the most understated is the First Nation culture, which has a rich and long history. There is a dark history as the first fleets came and conquered, took rather than asked, sought violence rather than peace. We have much we can learn from our aboriginal people, including how to be hospitable, what stewardship of the land looks like, especially around sustainability and renewable management of our living resources such as our fauna, flora and waterways.

I have spent only a small amount of time at the NATSICC (National Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council) conference, but I have learnt a few things and discovered a few resources. In discussion I discovered there is a crosscultural training course that is designed to assist new immigrants to Australia understand something of the culture and history of our nation. It will take you about 1.5 hours to complete and will cost you maybe \$20.00 – money well spent, I think. I was given the privilege of being the main celebrant at the Conference opening Mass. There are many First Nations people who are Catholic, and it was wonderful to be able to celebrate with them as they began a wonderful journey across the week, sharing this experience with people from

as far north as the Tiwi Islands, as far west as Broome and as far south as Tasmania. I caught up with two young representatives who were in high school at St James Catholic College, a parish school belonging to the Catholic Parish of the Huon Valley where I was parish priest. The most southern Catholic Community in Australia and probably the world, given it takes in Macquarie Island, where there are more than just seals there.

Check out the course. It will be an hour and a half worth spending.





SAFEGUARDING

This week, your attention is drawn to ensuring the safety of children on the beach. Beaches can be unpredictable, and children are particularly vulnerable to hazards such as deep water, strong currents, sharp objects, and getting lost. Proper supervision is essential at all times. Adults should always maintain sight of children and be close enough to intervene quickly if necessary. Flotation devices can be fun but offer false security unless parents are watching.

Children should be taught basic water safety rules, especially not swimming alone, and to swim between the red and yellow flags. Providing children with brightly coloured swimwear can also increase visibility and safety.

Sun protection is another key aspect of safeguarding. Applying high-SPF sunscreen regularly, encouraging children to wear hats and UV-protective clothing, and ensuring they stay hydrated will help prevent heatstroke and sunburn.

Establishing a meeting point in case a child gets separated can ease panic and assist in a swift reunion. If feeling unsafe, children should be told to go to a lifesaver or a family with young children.

Every family should download the Beachsafe app with the location, weather, surf conditions and hazards plus the local facilities for all 18,000 Australian beaches.




