FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

I am sorry that I won't be present for the Feast of Christ the King this weekend with you all. It is an important feast, finishing one year and helping us take steps into

the next year.

Fr Tony Potts and I have had a great time together celebrating with Fr Anton and his family and friends here in Sri Lanka. His Mass of Thanksgiving was a truly wonderful experience to be part of. Whilst all but my part was in Singhalese it was not hard to appreciate the fullness of the joy found in the people, the large gathering of clergy from Anton's journey, and the wonderful music. I did a small survey of participants regarding the Homily given by Anton's spiritual director: although 18 minutes long I was told it was really good. There was no doubting the passion of the homilist or his connection to Fr Anton.

Our time has included some wonderful sights and sounds, including a cultural show – fire eaters and fire walkers included. I really would like to know how they do that! I've watched tea being processed in a tea factory from picking to packing. BOPF tea is the best. I've fed and walked with elephants, feeling small against the breadth and depth of these pachyderms. I have, though, a better understanding of the spiritual needs of our brothers and sisters from Sri Lanka and their love of their home country. It is truly beautiful.

The roadways are chaotic in a most ordered way. Not one accident or dent did I see this first week. Somehow all the horn tooting and weaving seems to work. I am amazed that no one seems to get run over, or the dogs—which seem to take great delight in sleeping in the middle of the road--aren't victims of a tuk tuk (three-wheeler) or truck. It is hard to describe just how beautiful this country is or just how friendly the people are. I know in a small way why so many feel a need to return home in retirement. My plan to have a meal with those from Sri Lanka before Christmas is firming. Sri Lanka has its Christmas decorations up all ready!

This is such a mix of religious belief. It seems that on every street corner there is a shrine or statue. There are *many, many* statues of our saints. And the largest Buddhas I have ever seen. There are, like all cities, religious quarters. There are a growing number of mosques mixed among the Catholic Churches and Temples, which also seem to be on every corner. I feel religious harmony is going to be difficult to keep, going

forward. There is a religious pride in the people here, whether Buddhist or Catholic. Like us, their churches are beautiful. They have many priests. Sri Lanka is developing; you can see it in the roadways and building programs. It will be a challenge, as it does not want to lose sight of the simplicity of life that keeps hold of the most important things that faith brings.

The pride of faith is a lesson I feel we need to be more overt about. I don't mean that we should have lots of statues. I mean we should feel enough pride in being Catholic to want it visible. We should be proud of our faith—so proud we can't stop talking about it or showing it in the world.



WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO AT MASS Symbols of the Mass

The Liturgy of the Word In the Liturgy of the Word, God Himself speaks to His people. The Scriptures

proclaimed at Mass are not distant history but living speech—the voice of the Lord addressing us here and now. The Church listens,



responds, and allows the Word to take root and bear fruit in our hearts.

The readings from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the Epistles, and the Gospels are arranged so that over the course of the liturgical year we encounter the fullness of God's saving plan. When we stand for the Gospel, it is a sign of reverence for Christ present in His Word.

The homily that follows is not merely commentary but a continuation of God's speaking—a bridge between the Word proclaimed and the life we live.

We pause between the readings to give us time for quiet reflection on what we have just heard.

The Responsorial Psalm began in ancient Jewish worship as a simple call-and-response prayer. In our Mass, it is not "background music", it is **Scripture**, meant to be proclaimed. It functions as the assembly's **"response" to the Word of God,** connects thematically to the First Reading, and prepares our hearts for the Gospel. **Scripture:** "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." — Psalm 119:105


