When Moses led the people from Egypt they wandered in the wilderness for 40 years. This was a time of renewing themselves after their time in Egypt and rediscovering their covenant with God. After his baptism, Jesus retreats to the wilderness to prepare for his public ministry. It was also out of the wilderness that a lot of rebellion and unrest emerged. A desire for change and action is what comes out of the wilderness.

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parish Family,



As of 10 December, a social media ban will take effect for those 16 and under. An attempt to prevent on-line bullying and predatory behaviour. When I was a child whilst bullying was a real thing in schools,

we all got a break from it when we went home. The old-fashioned phone of my childhood could simply be taken off its cradle, and all a caller would hear was an engaged signal. You probably don't even know what they looked like. However, there were no mid-night posts, no clandestine texting, no sense of missing out if we were not connected continuously.

We have as a society, community and as a church a responsibility to protect the most vulnerable, our children and vulnerable adults. It is a responsibility and an obligation on our part, a moral imperative. I am not convinced a total ban will work. Listening to commentators and interviews with parents there will be too many challenges to it. Parents and care givers will need to be even more vigilant if the ban has any chance. Unlike my generation this generation of young people are born Tech savvy. They can work their way around almost any block. It is a sad reality that we are more connected to each other via media platforms than face to face interaction.

No system is foolproof. In my mind education is key to almost everything. Bans don't necessarily solve anything. Families, schools, community groups and churches have a role to play in the education of our young people in cyber and social safety. Education and formation are key. Responsible persons must be informed and remain up to date. Open and honest communication is important. Our vulnerable need reliable and safe havens to fall back on. They need to be able to tell their safe person anything and know they will not be judged but rather heard and supported. Our kids get into trouble and sometimes find themselves in difficult situations. They need our help to get out of them. Sometimes parents and grandparents need to practice a 'I'm not shocked by that' face.

On another note, I have begun my Christmas shopping. It ranks amongst the hardest things I face each year. What to get my now teenage nieces is daunting, overwhelming. I have a strict budget though. I've worked out over many years that money doesn't compensate for lack of time spent nor does it equate to love. It really is the thought that counts. Getting into huge debt for the new year because of Christmas I have decided is not helpful. The things I treasure most from the gifts my family have sent are the ones my

nephew and nieces made me or painted for me when they were little. They are amongst my priceless possessions.

Advent is a wonderful time for reflecting on what is really important. Getting some priorities sorted and making sure that the next steps are firmly founded on the priceless values of our relationship with the saviour we prepare for.

Light and Candles ◆

From the earliest Christian gatherings, light has been a symbol of Christ's presence. Candles placed on the altar or beside the ambo remind us that the Lord is the Light of the World.



The flame, gentle yet steady,

represents faith that perseveres through darkness. It draws the eye upward, inviting prayer and reverence. When candles are carried in procession or placed near the Blessed Sacrament, they honour the holiness of what they accompany.

Even a single flame in a quiet church proclaims that darkness never has the last word.


Come, divine Comforter, source of harmony, unite the hearts and minds of believers. Come and grant us to taste the beauty of communion.
