Dear Parish Family,

I am an avid real football follower, the Australian Football League! I have followed the AFL and the Hawthorn football club since I was 11. On Thursday night the mighty Hawks defeated St Kilda by 58 points. Hawthorn, whilst not always the winners, they always do themselves proud. What I have enjoyed this season is the re-inventing of their play and the trialling a few different things on the field. Hawthorn, by innovative plays and thinking 'outside the box' plays, has seen a resurgence in their run of consecutive wins. It is much more interesting to watch, and other teams are going to need to do the same things to beat them.

You have been reading a lot about our Assembly of late; it is the 'biggest game' in town. We hope that we will learn much from what comes in.

Whilst I don't want to equate our Assembly or our Faith with a game of football, there is much to be learnt from the game. Teams, to be successful, put effort into practising. The practice hones their skills and, when they hit the ground for the game, the game is better played. A post-game reflection is helpful, too, in seeing where things can be improved. As a member of the Hawthorn Football club, I am actively invited to not only attend the game, but to share the 'joy' of the club with others, to be excited about being a member and to encourage others to be supporters too. I enjoy listening to the commentators' and the coaches' post-game reflections on where things worked and where there were lessons to be learned. The practices, the games and the post-game are all important for the success of not only the team, but the club itself. It all fits a big picture.

Our Assembly, I know, is going to help us in all areas of our parish and as a faith filled community. Setting our priorities and then working a plan to ensure those priorities are met are outcomes we are looking for. We are always looking for ways to be better as a church and to put into practice the witness, invitation and obligation of being a follower of Jesus Christ. Like members of the Hawthorn Football Club, each of us is called to play our part. It doesn't matter whether you 'run' out on to the field, attend the game, or coach the team. It takes all of us to ensure the success of 'The Club'. No one can be done without or is less important than another. All of us contribute at all levels to ensure success.

For the Love of Creation

In the year of Saint Francis we have all been asked to contribute to the wellbeing of our environment. To that end Fr Niel and a group of parishioners have been discussing a bottle and can recycling effort that will not only ensure more bottles and cans are recycled but will also raise funds for Catholic charities.



This is both a call for volunteers and a request for clean drink cans and bottles that have had a 10c deposit paid and can be cashed in.

We need you to separate the cans and bottles and bring them to the Cathedral when you come for Mass. There will be 2 bins at the front of the cathedral and we ask you to put bottles in one and cans in the other, according to the signs on the bins.

The can or bottle label must be readable by the machine that counts them, so we ask you to only donate items that are intact, labels in place and don't squash the cans please.

In order to make this effort work we will need volunteers, especially someone with a ute or trailer to take the bottles and cans to the recycling depot.

We need both volunteers and bottles and cans to make this work so please be generous. See it as one opportunity to make your own contribution to the Year of St Francis.

Safeguarding: E-bikes

In safeguarding their children, parents/carers need to know that **electric bike (e-bike) injuries among children in NSW have surged**, with over 150 children hospitalised in 2025, more than double the previous year.

Key Trends and Data in NSW (2025–2026):

- **Severity of Injuries:** Doctors describe these as resembling motorcycle accidents rather than bicycle falls.
- **Common Injuries:** Severe head trauma, fractured bones, lacerated spleens or livers (from handlebar impacts), and deep tissue wounds.
- **Safety Factors:** Many injured children were not wearing helmets, and/or involved **illegally modified bikes** exceeding the legal 25km/h speed limit.
- **Pedestrian Risk:** Children (and others) are being injured while walking, after being struck by e-bikes.

Action Taken to Improve Safety:

- **New Standards:** In March 2026, NSW adopted European safety standards (EN15194) to phase out high-powered e-bikes that act more like motorbikes.
- **Stricter Rules:** Police allowed to seize and crush illegal e-bikes, and authorities investigating setting minimum riding ages.

Safety Tips for Parents:

- Ensure the helmet fits correctly, with **snug straps and a two-finger gap above eyebrows**.
- Ensure that the e-bike is compliant with the 250-watt limit and avoid purchasing high-speed, modified bikes for children.

Eucharist28 Update – Hearts Set Ablaze!

The International Eucharistic Congress in Sydney in 2028 ('Eucharist28') will be a global gathering of the Church centred on the Eucharist, the source and summit of our Christian lives, culminating in a Papal Mass with Pope Leo XIV. It will be a festival of faith, rich with worship, prayer, testimonies, art, music – a truly 'once in a lifetime' experience, and a transformative moment for our nation.

At the very first Pentecost, the apostles were transformed as the fire of the Holy Spirit was poured out for them, empowering them to go out to evangelise the world. "And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts, praising God." – Acts of the Apostles 2:46-47

The early Church was *Eucharistic*. They gathered together in community and shared in the breaking of the bread. It was through believing in and sharing in Christ's body and blood that the Holy Spirit set their hearts ablaze, strengthening them to spread the Good News without fear.

As we move forward from our celebration of Pentecost, our parishes and communities can imitate the early Church by devoting ourselves to the Eucharist and allowing the Holy Spirit to work within us – in our ministries, our youth groups, and our personal prayer.

This national journey to Eucharist28 is an invitation for all of us to be set on fire by the Holy Spirit and share in the breaking of the bread. The journey begins now, in our own hearts, in our own parishes.

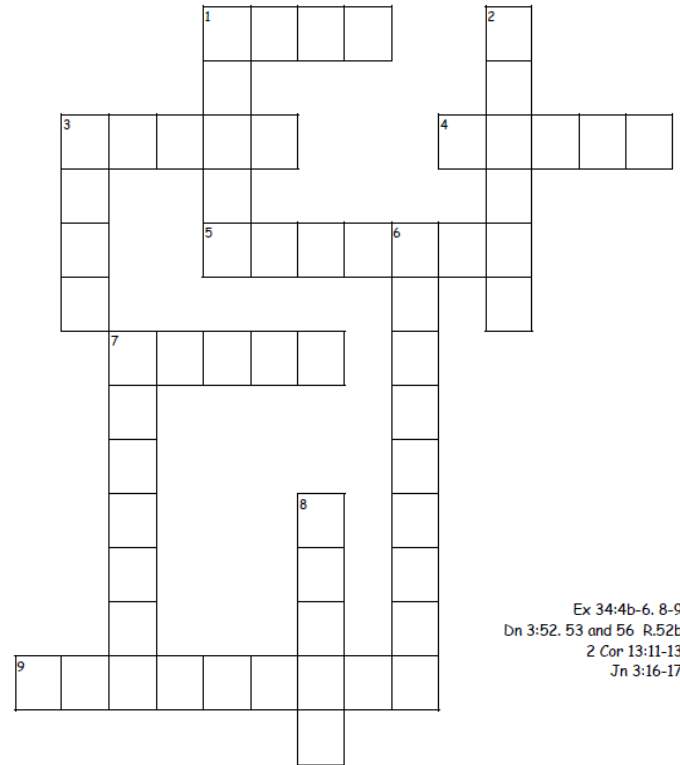
