Dear Parish Family,

BIG NEWS, HOT OFF THE PRESS! Fr Niel and his 'recycling' team are launching officially this weekend 'For the Love of Creation'! This Parish initiative is in honour of Laudato Si. The team is asking you to bring your bottles and cans to the parish so that they can be returned for cash. The money raised will go to our charities: Caritas Australia, Catholic Mission, the Holy Land and St Vincent de Paul. I know Fr Niel is still looking for more volunteers to help with this initiative, including with the collection, promotion and return! I know, ladies, I mentioned that if your husband was getting under your feet, you could donate him to the cause; the offer still stands! Ladies, there is opportunity for you to help as well – many hands make light work.

The parish has amazing people on our Baptism and Funeral Ministry teams. We have room for more hands and voices if you have time and are thinking about being more fully involved in our Catholic life and mission. The baptism team is such a multi-generational space with a couple of young mums helping prepare young families as they begin the sacramental journey for their bubs. The Baptism team currently meets once a month, the first Tuesday of the month at 7.00pm. As a team, we try and make the road to baptism as gentle and joyful as possible, ensuring each of our families gets personalised support and accompaniment. You don't have to be a parent or have had a child baptised. You need a willingness to support families through what is a most exciting first step on a lifelong journey with the church and faith. If you are interested let me know, or come to an information night and test whether this is your ministry.

Allied to the baptism team I would like to begin the God Start program in the parish. It is simply a beautiful way to stay in touch with the littlies once baptised: a card for their birthday and a card on the anniversary of their baptism up to age 5 – school age. The commitment is simply writing the card and popping it in the mail! This is one you could do sitting in front of the tellie with a coffee after dinner.

The funeral ministry team probably suits those who have flexibility and freedom during the day, to meet with families and support them during what is a difficult time in a family's life. It is helping them be ready for the funeral celebration, as well as ongoing contact should a person or family need it. There are practical things to be done, emotional support to be offered and a friendly compassionate face to be shown. We've all been where these families are, or, if you haven't, one day you will be. You get training and support in what I know is a privileged place to be. Families appreciate greatly the care they receive. We get to be the face of Jesus for someone very tangibly. I love hearing the stories of families as they gather to say farewell, the words of remembrance (eulogy) are always insightful, the relationships built transformative. Need to know more? I can connect you to a team member who can share with you their lived experience, sharing what they give and just how much they receive because a family needed help in their time of sorrow.

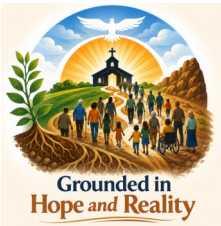

Our **first Assembly** invited us into deep listening around the hopes, experiences and aspirations of our communities. In the **second Assembly** session, these themes were prayerfully echoed and discerned through the lens of Communion, Participation and Mission. Across both gatherings, we heard a strong desire for belonging, welcome, outreach, formation, and deeper connection within our communities.

This next gathering will focus on the practical realities, the “nuts and bolts” of parish life across our region. Together, we will prayerfully discern how we move forward as a synodal Church, grounded in both hope and reality.

The guiding questions for the day will be:

1. What is preventing our communities from fully living the hopes and aspirations identified during the first and second Assembly sessions?
2. What practical, spiritual or pastoral changes are needed for us to move forward together?

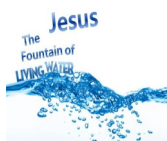

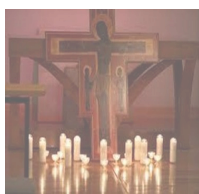

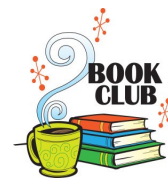

In the year of Saint Francis we have all been asked to contribute to the wellbeing of our environment. To that end Fr Niel and a group of parishioners have been discussing a bottle and can recycling effort that will not only ensure more bottles and cans are recycled but will also raise funds for Catholic charities.



This is both a call for volunteers and a request for clean drink cans and bottles that have had a 10c deposit paid and can be cashed in.

We need you to separate the cans and bottles and bring them to the Cathedral when you come for Mass. There will be 2 bins at the front of the cathedral and we ask you to put bottles in one and cans in the other, according to the signs on the bins. The can or bottle label must be readable by the machine that counts them, so we ask you to only donate items that are intact, labels in place and don't squash the cans please.

In order to make this effort work we will need volunteers, especially someone with a ute or trailer to take the bottles and cans to the recycling depot. We need both volunteers and bottles and cans to make this work so please be generous. See it as one opportunity to make your own contribution to the Year of St Francis.

Safeguarding - Dementia #1

In safeguarding our seniors, we need to be aware that **dementia is the number one cause of deaths in Australia** (AIHW - Australian Institute of Health & Welfare, 05 Dec 2025). This week, and next week, our bulletin articles will focus on promoting our community awareness of dementia – what it is, what each person can do to reduce its impact, and what government agencies are doing to address its influence.

Dementia is an umbrella term, **usually** associated with older people, describing conditions that affect memory, thinking, behaviour, and the ability to perform everyday activities, with Alzheimer's disease being the most common form.

The AIHW estimates that there is 1 in 16 people with dementia per 1,000 Australians. The rate of dementia rises quickly with age, from less than one person with dementia per 1,000 Australians aged 30–59, to 84 people with dementia per 1,000 Australians aged 65 and over, and 292 per 1,000 Australians aged 85 and over. Nearly two-thirds (63%, or nearly 266,000) of Australians with dementia are women, while 37% (or 159,000) of Australians are men – a result impacted by women, on average, living longer than men.

Next week, the article will cover **controllable dementia risk factors**. Lack of knowledge of these factors remains a major public health challenge.

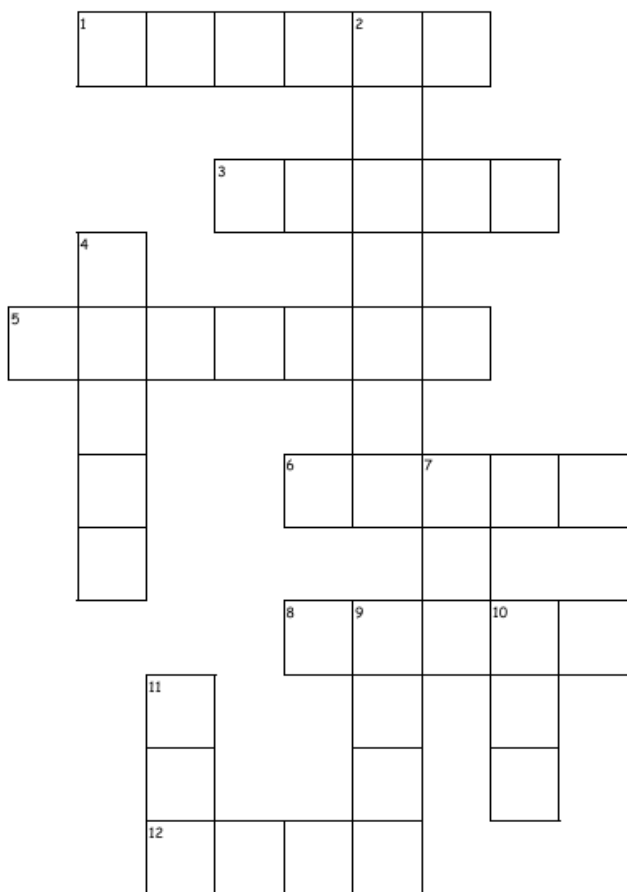

GOSPEL FOCUS

Real Presence

In the gospel passage, Jesus speaks a number of times about his followers eating his flesh and drinking his blood; "For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink." In the Eucharist, we celebrate the 'real presence' of Jesus, understanding that bread and wine is changed into the body and blood of Christ. This change does not occur in a physical, observable way. The Church teaches that the 'substance' of bread and wine (what makes them bread and wine in essence) is changed but not the physical attributes. This is known as 'transubstantiation' – change of substance.
