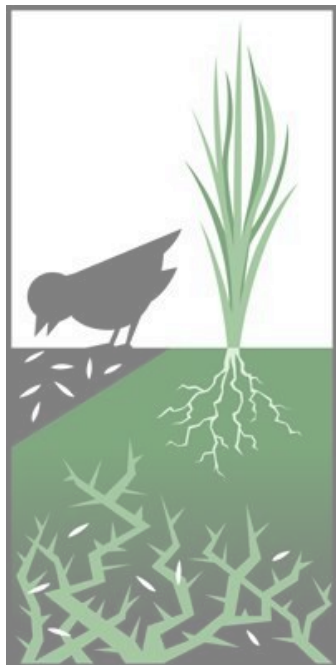

Dear Parish Family,

Recently I met informally with the regional executive officer of the St Vincent de Paul in their office across the road from the Cathedral. The St Vincent de Paul society has been a major presence in many Australian Catholic parishes for over a century; they continue to be an important presence in this parish as well. Membership in the local conferences is an essential element of the good works they support the church in. Recently you would have seen their winter appeal envelopes on the pews when you attended Mass - and probably donated to the cause. They could also use some more volunteers. They are always needing more members in the conferences to assist their support of those in need.

We are seeing a rise in the numbers of people who find themselves struggling in these difficult times and who need the assistance of agencies and volunteers such as St Vincent de Paul. More and more people, it seems, are finding themselves homeless - whether sleeping rough on the streets, in their cars, or the hidden homelessness, couch surfing. This last 'homelessness' affects mostly women over 55 and teenagers.

We are blessed to have two St Vincent de Paul conferences here in our parishes. St Vincent de Paul has recently acquired a food van and has begun an outreach program to those doing it tough on the streets. I will meet in the next week with the coordinator of the program and the regional president of Vinnies to work out some ways that we can support this initiative. I am keen that our parish be in partnership with the good works already being carried out around us by many agencies.

Would you be interested in this initiative as a volunteer? Before moving to NSW in 2015, I sat as a member of the Vinnies Food Van board of governance in Hobart and took a turn each month on their outreach program distributing food across Hobart. Every parish I served had a couple of teams who joined me. Our High Schools helped prepare food and some of our teachers and Year 12s volunteered. Vinnies had 5 vans that went each night to various parts of Hobart. Each van provided hot food, hot drinks, bread, blankets, clothing, contacts for support and importantly dignity, a smiling face and a non-judgemental help-up to those doing it tough. Twice a year the vans came off the road and instead the society hired ('borrowed') halls where a three-course meal complete with music, laughs and good conversation in the safety and warmth of a 'dining' hall was served. Our Popes in recent years have continued to remind us of the importance of the dignity of the human person - this is a space where it is needed and finds its flesh. **Interested? Hit me up!**

On another note, I am progressing with a big group of people the audio issues we seem to have in every church, and particularly the Cathedral. It is going to cost us some money (\$80,000 roughly) to sort it, but it will be worth it for the great work the choir, the readers, and the clergy do in celebrating our liturgies, including our Masses on Sunday and the wonderful work you do as missionary disciples in the Lord's vineyard.

Bring hope on Sea Sunday



Australian Catholics have been encouraged to reflect on the lives and experiences of mariners on Sea Sunday. National director of Stella Maris Australia, Fr Tony Cox SSC, said mariners live on the margins of society and most of their working life is spent beyond the reach of land.

"One visiting seafarer said to me: 'People do not see us and because of our invisibility they think we are not human. They do not see what we do and forget that we too have needs'." He said the experience of the COVID pandemic, when seafarers were unable to set foot on dry land for a year and a half, and now the war-torn seas of the Straits of Hormuz highlight how dangerous the work is.

"It is a lonely life and when away from family and friends this adds to the isolation they may experience," Fr Tony said. "Enduring treacherous seas is a reality we can easily gloss over too."

"Through helping and supporting their spiritual and material needs, advocating for their dignity and human rights and also championing strengthened international relations, Stella Maris continues to serve our human family no matter the nationality, creed or background."

Noting the Gospel reading for Sea Sunday, Fr Tony said Jesus spoke of seeds being sown generously.

"The work of Stella Maris is like sowing seeds," he said. "Every visit, every conversation, is a seed planted in a life that is often hard, isolated and unseen."

"You may never meet the people who benefit, but your support helps that seed take root."

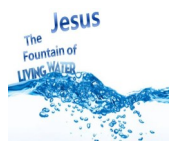

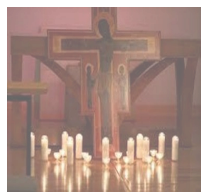

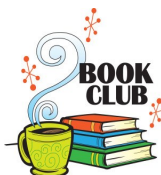

Imelda's words capture the heart of our Return and Earn project: helping others while caring for our environment.

Thanks to the generous support of our parish community, we've already raised **\$185.90** —a fantastic start, with **1,859** containers diverted from landfill.

Our *Cathedral drop off bin* is now located in the **foyer near the main entrance** and we welcome clean cans & bottles with 10c return for NSW on them. Alternatively, containers can be taken directly to nearby points: **Aventus Kotara Home Woolworths Return and Earn Machine** 30 Northcott Drive, Kotara or **Swell Point** 4 Gross Street, Carrington. Return and Earn vouchers can be given to our priests, sacristans, or placed on the collection plates during Mass. As we continue to grow this initiative, we are seeking volunteers from **St Joseph's, St Mary's, Tighes Hill, Stockton, and Mayfield** to help expand the program across our Mass centres.

Safeguarding

TO OUR KIDS - SAFEGUARDING BY DIOCESAN WORKERS :

All people who work for or help our Maitland Newcastle Diocese agree to follow important rules to support you in being safe and happy. These rules are written in a *Safeguarding Commitment Statement* requiring these people to take care of you, and to tell someone like your parents, your principal, teacher or police if they know you have been hurt. A hurt might be:

- **Physical** - no one should ever shake, slap, punch or kick you
- **Emotional** – no one should make threats that scare you, swear at you, or embarrass you
- **Sexual** – no one should talk to you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable or touch your private parts. They shouldn't ask you to touch their private parts, show you photos of nude people nor to take your clothes off.

Things that adults should **NOT** do to you:

- Take you away from your friends just to be alone with them
- Make you do things when alone with them that make you feel worried then trying to make you keep these things secret from one or both parents
- Contact you on social media or mobile phone without your parents knowing.

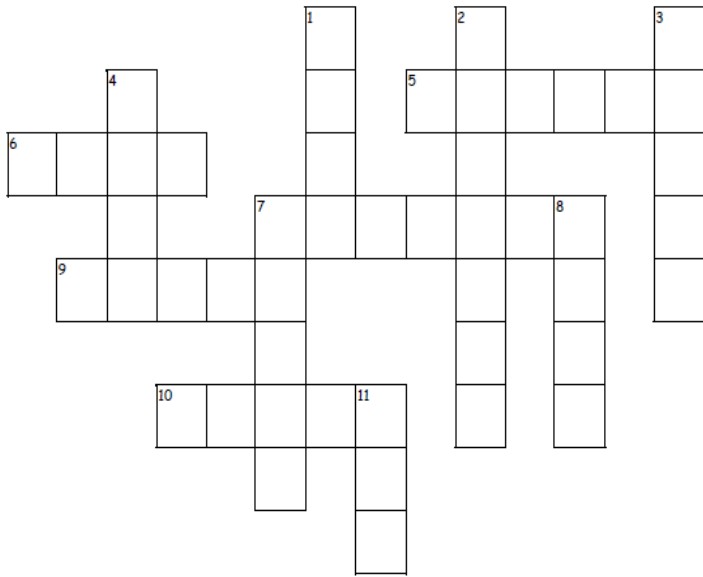
Living the Gospel

The teaching of the parable of the sower is as true for us today as it was in its original context. The word of the kingdom continues to fall on people who are at various stages of readiness to receive it. What Jesus suggests to his disciples – and to us – is that the 'good soil' can't always be predicted. Jesus doesn't tell his disciples to only sow the word in people who are receptive. Rather, he wants them – and us – to scatter the word everywhere and to rejoice when it does find good soil and yields a rich harvest.
