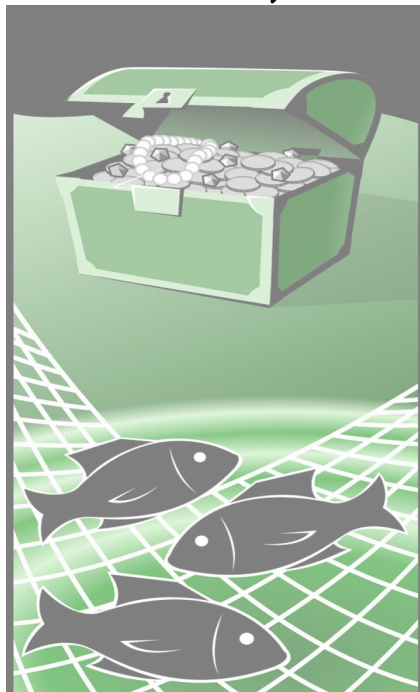

Dear Parish Family,

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

I was recently reading a small article on the construction of a series of stone shelters along the foreshore near Newcastle Beach. Not much is left of these shelters. However, if you have time to wander onto the beach just below 'Noah's on the Beach', you will likely descend a series of steps dating back to the very beginning of the 1900s and which, at one time, surrounded the remnants of a fountain. The stone is unusual as it has a pink stripe in it. The stone is called 'gneiss' and is understood to be stone taken from the ballast of trading ships which arrived in Newcastle from South America, likely Rio De Janeiro, in Brazil. Ballast is what keeps an empty ship stable on the ocean, as it travels looking for cargo. Once the cargo is loaded, the ballast is no longer needed.



The ballast stone was likely off loaded over years, before finally being used in the retaining walls along Newcastle beach. I think it is fascinating and, if you are from Brazil, you might have felt a sense of belonging here in Newcastle, without realising that part of your homeland was already here waiting for you. For all of us it is a wonderful part of Newcastle history and a way for us to feel a sense of the broader nature of this community in the world sense. We are '6 degrees of separation' from everywhere, everyone and everything, seemingly. I felt warm and fuzzy reading that small catch of history and reflecting on not only where it came from, the people from the same place, but also the hundreds of thousands of men, women and children who have set foot on it.

It could be a wonderful place to spend time with family and/or friends on a Sunday after Mass. Do we do enough just spending time with the people who are important to us? Just being together rather than always doing? Those steps are a good place to just be! However, if you need to 'do' while you are 'being', there is an amazing ice-cream shop a heartbeat along the road. Is it ever too cold for ice-cream!!

You will see an invite in this newsletter to attend an information evening for the Vinnies food vans. I met with their van leadership recently and I am excited that we, as a parish, might be able to partner with them in a very worthwhile ministry. On cold nights, particularly, I note the number of homeless around, and this is one place that we could perhaps help someone up. As I've mentioned, it costs nothing to be kind, compassionate and to give dignity; a smiling face and a hot cup of coffee can change the world. The meeting is on the 5th of August at 6.00pm in the Toohey Room, near the Diocesan offices. It is a 'no obligation' invite. Not every ministry is an opportunity for everyone. However, in this ministry there is a place for those who may feel that being out on the streets is not their calling, whilst behind the scenes work is. No harm in hearing and seeing what is on offer.

The work of the Parish Assembly coordinating team goes on. Thanks again to Rose, Teresa, Allen, Gail, and Alicia for their hard work preparing for and drawing from the assembly phases. It is no small feat, this planning for the future. I am pleased that we have this opportunity. It is both exciting and hope filled.
